# President Speert Inaugurated

State Sen. Matthew Feldman said that the WPC campus has been "the scene of substantial changes in curricula. These changes place WPC on the forefront of the new nation-wide lodge toward educational excellence."

In his address for President Arnold Speert's inauguration last Friday, Feldman said that according to national reports which judge the standards of excellence, "Paterson comes closest to satisfying all of the recommended curricular requirements than any other institution of higher learning in the nation. It is a fact that the changes that have been made in the curriculum between spring 1979 and February 1986 placed this institution thirdly in step with the most contemporary thinking about the fundamental content of a useful education."

Sen. Feldman was the author of the 1966 legislation that transformed the state teachers colleges into today's multi-purpose liberal arts institutions. He is the author of current legislation to grant autonomy to the state colleges. He was also designated by the Democratic party as a candidate for Bergen county executive in the June primary election.

## Inauguration

Pomp and circumstance started on Friday afternoon in Shea Center and ended Saturday night with the inaugural ball celebrating WPC's sixth and youngest president.

Salutations were given by: Mark Anders, SGA president; Helen Mault, past president of the Alumni Association; Lee Hummel, chairperson of the Faculty Senate; Irwin Nack, president for the American Federation of Teachers Local 1796; Herman James, president of Glassboro State College and Laurence Marcus, director for the office of State Colleges Department of Higher Education.

Mault received a chuckle from the full auditorium during her salutation by telling Speert, "you came, you taught, you stayed."

James, the only college president to speak at the inauguration, received an even longer applause when he said, "with Arnie's young age (40), I don't have to worry about being the youngest president, now it's Arnie's burden! I automatically become older and wiser." After commending Speert, James thanked Speert's wife for her support in his presidency and then kissed both of them after his speech.

## Installation of the President

After salutations, Russell Hawkins, chairperson of the Board of Trustees, officially installed the President upon which the audience gave a standing ovation.

## Inaugural Address

President Speert's response, "The College and Its Community" highlighted WPC's claim upon a drive for excellence. The drive began nine years ago under former President Seymour C. Hyman who was in attendance at the inauguration.

Speert said that when WPC started its drive, "we accepted 85 percent of all those who applied; now we offer admission to about one of two applicants. The average scholastic Aptitude Test is 100 points above that of students a decade ago."

## Faculty

Speert praised WPC's faculty stating that many are actively involved in the advancement of their discipline, "and perhaps even more significantly, many involve students in

their scholarship."

## GE

"Our general education program entreats students to learn about the humanities, sciences, social sciences and arts. It mandated a sensitivity to social problems related to race and gender. As a result of recent alterations, the curriculum insures that students grasp the history of western civilization and introduces them to non-western civilization," Speert said.

## Advising and Counselling

The president asked the college community to place a "renewed emphasis upon advising and counselling our students. An attrition rate which is greater than 50 percent is unacceptable." He then called for a reemphasis upon the "supremacy of the faculty-student relationship."

## Enrollment

Speert said he would devote his efforts to retain a greater number of minority students. He added that the problem of black and Hispanic enrollment has reached crisis proportions in our country, and that WPC must strive to increase the current 7 percent black and 4 percent Hispanic enrollment.

"I remain cognizant of our state's position as the major exporter of college-going high school graduates. I believe we lose bright and creative contributors to the state's work force by sending 40 percent of our college-going youth to other states," Speert said.

## Students

The president said he wants to underscore the recommendation of the National Institute of Education, that students become involved in their education. He said, "myriad opportunities exist for students at WPC and they should 'choose, create, and experiment' with them."

He added that while recognizing the importance of participation, the college has made sure that academic process of the student is paramount. "We were the first state college to require a minimum cumulative grade point

average of C for students to participate in sports, clubs, or activities," Speert said.

He also said he is impressed by the maturity and ability of the student leaders at WPC and will further heighten their experiences and accomplishments for the student body.

## Graduates and Alumni

Speert asked Alumni and undergraduates for their continued support for merit and need scholarships. He said, "the indiscriminate cuts of Gramm-Rudman-Hollings will discriminate, I fear, far too painfully among those who would traditionally attend state colleges and universities."

## Communication Center for New Jersey

In his response, Speert mentioned that he believes WPC possesses the wherewithal to become the communication center for northern New Jersey, and said he will "Foster that development."

## Pioneers

"William Paterson College is greater than its 250 acres; greater than its 350 faculty; greater than its 500 non-teaching employees; greater than its 40 undergraduate and 14 graduate programs. Speert said, and concluded with, "We are the Pioneers, improving already strong programs, providing alert and creative minds, breaking new ground ... together."

Feldman said he believes William Paterson College has the means capable of creating a new type of elite that once used to exist in America.

"I see the men and women of whom comprise the faculty and administration of William Paterson College as people who are determined to restore higher education as a shaper of national leaders, and I rejoice in the prospect of this new drive for educational excellence that it will be successful," Feldman said.

Among the honored guests were 15 presidents, five college officials, 24 alumni, and five professionals and learned society delegates.

## • Jorma Kaukonen In Concert

"This ain't no place to do homework," said the inebriated young man as he spied the notebook in my hand.

"Well, I'm going to interview Jorma later . . ." I started to say.

"I interviewed Jorma once," he slurred.

"Yeah?"

"Yeah, I said, 'Hey Jorma, What is up?' And he said, 'Rock and Roll.'"

This scenario provides only a small picture of what the excited crowd looked like before Jorma Kaukonen stepped on stage Sunday night. Feisty is an appropriate word. They were ready for a show.

The soundmen must have had a feeling about the type of music the crowd would like, and as a result, played a live Grateful Dead tape complete with space jam and all. There certainly were a lot of Dead heads in the ballroom that night, and every one of them was soaking up the ever flowing, tumbling guitar licks of Jerry Garcia.

The audience was vocally appreciative of the soundmen's intuition. In other

words, they were getting louder as the night grew long.

When Jorma finally hit the stage, the audience responded with a roar which sustained and gradually mellowed over the course of two or three songs into a silence of intense listening.

Jorma's intricate web of syncopated blues and ragtime guitar transformed the audience from a noisy crowd into a respectable assembly of music lovers. Songs like Hesitation Blues, Road Walkin' Blues, Keep Your Lamps Trimmed and Burnin' and Keep on Truckin' held all eyes and ears on Jorma's fluid fingers and growling voice, respectively.

He used the dynamics of the room effectively, shifting from loud bursts of chordal strumming to soft cascades of single note runs. At many times during the night the tapping of his boot heel against the hard wood floor could be heard below the ring of his guitar.

The audience listened politely for the remainder of the performance. Jorma thanked them, "It's a pleasure to be able to hear myself. When I play at The Lone Star I can't hear myself over the clinking of the beer glasses," he said.









WPC celebrated Black History Month all through February with concerts, lectures, films, workshops, plays and social affairs.

Bobby Seale, former leader of the Black Panthers and also one of the co-defendants in the Chicago Seven conspiracy trial in 1969, will discuss *The New Black Liberation of the Eighties* on Feb. 4 at 8 p.m. in the Student Center Ballroom. On Feb. 24, Dr. Mary Frances Berry, professor of history and law at Howard University and Commissioner on the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights, will lecture at 2 p.m. in the Student Center Ballroom.

*Home*, Samm-Art Williams Broadway hit, will be presented at the college on Feb. 7, 8 and 9. The play will be performed by the NOW company of Paterson in conjunction with the WPC theater department and will take place in the Hunziker theater on campus. Performances are scheduled at 8 p.m. each evening. There

will be a Sunday matinee on Feb. 9 at 3 p.m. Tickets are \$5 general admission and \$2.50 for students and senior citizens. For reservations call 595-2335.

The Black Students Association at WPC will present *Brother, Can I Speak for You?* on Feb. 19 at 8 p.m. in the Performing Arts Lounge in the Student Center. There is no charge. The play depicts eight great black American leaders through the use of poems, speeches, song and mime.

Concerts scheduled for Black History Month will include: *Rock Against Racism*, featuring rock, jazz and reggae bands, on Feb. 1 at 8 p.m. in the Student Center Ballroom; and *Pieces of a Dream* on Feb. at 8 p.m. in the Shea Center of Performing Arts. Tickets are \$5.50 for students and \$7.50 general admission.

Movies include: *Here and Now* on Feb. 1, *Fast Break* on Feb. 8 and 9 and *D.C. Cab* on Feb. 23 and 24.



# WPSC — The New Clock Format

WPSC, in an attempt to gain "direction" in its sound, has introduced a format clock into its programming, according to Elena Brino, the station's program director.

Brino said that the 60-minute clock, which is used from 7:30 a.m.-3 p.m. daily, is sectioned into 12 intervals, and consists of musical selections that are classified by one of three label colors.

"Songs that are labeled blue are played heavily, black labels are played moderately, and yellow labels are played the least," she said. Brino said that the heavily rotated songs might be heard twice a day, and the others only once daily. "Usually, you'll hear a particular song about six times per week," she said, adding that approximately half of the labeled songs fall off the programming each week so new ones can enter.


According to Brino, a good way to describe WPSC's sound is "progressive top-40." "That's a combination of AOR (Album Oriented Rock) selections and songs that are on the current charts," she explained. Brino

said that most of the songs chosen for the clock are taken from the AOR charts of trade magazines such as Radio and Record and College Media Journal. "Less than 10 percent of the music comes from the contemporary hit charts," she said.

Brino said that the station is operating better on the new format compared to the old one, which permitted each DJ to choose his own selections. "The station has more direction in sound," she said. "Before, one might hear jazz followed by heavy metal, which isn't very listenable. Now, the music flows much better."

Another benefit of the format clock that Brino pointed out was that it acts as a training-ground for communication majors. She said that most major radio stations use clocks, and experience with them at WPSC can provide students with good background information after college. "Also, with the use of the clock, new DJ's don't have to worry about programming and can concentrate on other things," she said, adding that most of the new jocks have enjoyed working with the clock so far.

In 1985 national powerhouse Lock Haven will visit Wightman Field, and this time the Pioneers will try and win the war.



Since the fencing program began, the women's squad has captured the National Intercollegiate Women's Fencing Association Championship eight times — 1956, 1958, 1961, 1962, 1964, 1965 and 1966. Currently, 1985/86 looks to be the 40th winning season for Pioneer women's fencing.

"NCAA restrictions on Division I teams have made our schedule a bit lighter than usual" says Head Coach Ray Miller. This season the Pioneers will participate in both the Temple Open and the Penn State Open. Other opponents for the Pioneers will include Rutgers, Princeton, Navy, Stevens and Vassar.

The major opponent for WPC this year will be FDU. If the Pioneers can get by FDU then the road may be clear for the state championships. When asked about FDU, Miller commented, "They are the


defending champions and have recruited additional strength."

Head Coach Ray Miller has recorded a 357-100 career mark in 39 years at the helm of the women's program, and he looks to add more victories to that mark this season.

The offensive line will play a key role in the Pioneer success this season, and throwing those key blocks for the Pioneers



Jersey state championship in the 200-meter butterfly.



## Another Fine Season

The 1986 Pioneer "Lumber Company" concluded the spring campaign with a 30-win 9-loss 2-tie record.

The Pioneers captured their first New Jersey Athletic Conference Championship since 1983 by defeating the Indians of Montclair State, but the team fell short in their quest to make a return trip to the NCAA Division III World Series. After winning their first game of the NCAA Regionals, the Pioneers were defeated by Montclair, and a 10-8 loss to Johns Hopkins University eliminated the Pioneers from the Regional Tourney.

A relatively young club, several outstanding performances were turned in by this talent laden group of men. Sophomore Frank Barker (Emerson) started the season by learning a new position third base and by the season's end he often resembled Philadelphia Phillie star Mike Schmidt. Barker hit .351 on the year, and belted out seven home runs, while leading the team in both RBI's (51) and doubles (12).


The Pioneer solid middle infield combo of shortstop Glen Meren-



Merendino and Petrucelli are both strong hitters, as Merendino posted a .299 batting average, along with a record single season 49 walks, while Petrucelli finished with a .418 batting average, along with five home runs.

The catching duties were split between Carmine Romano (JR., Leonia) and Ken Nuzzi (SO., Bayonne). In 29 games Romano hit .388, had 28 RBI's, and four home runs. One of Romano's round-trippers was a dramatic shot in the tenth inning against Jersey City State that lifted the Pioneers to a 5-4 victory over the Gothic Knights. Nuzzi put in 19 appearances for the Pioneers, hit .300 and proved an admirable foe to opposing pitching staffs.




