William Paterson College in Wayne has been restoring Hobart Manor, an historic building on its campus, for several years. The institution is in the process of applying for a grant from the New Jersey Historic Trust pursuant to the Historic Preservation Bond Program, and I am writing to support that grant application.


The college has already committed a great deal of its own resources to the project and deserves strong consideration for an effort that reflects its commitment to and relationship with my district and the northern New Jersey region. When it was occupied and owned by the Hobarts, the Manor was a center of social activity for the region.
