Gift Given By Violinist, Olga Hajos

Olga Hajos, famous violinist, appeared at the assembly Wednesday, January 5. Her accompanist was Helen Buchanan.

The program included: "Largo" by Handel, her opening number, followed by "Preludium Allegro" by Pugnani-Kreisler-Rondo" by Mozart-Kreisler-Sarasate's "Romanza Andante-Wieniawski's "Souvenir de Moscow," the De Falla-Kreisler "Spanish Dance," the Chopin-Vienna "Nocturno," Kreisler's "Gipsy Airs," and the final number, Sarasate's "Gipsy Airs." Miss Hajos was a student at the Royal Academy of Music Budapest, where she studied with Jenö Von Hubay from whom she received the coveted Diploma and who pronounced her one of the most successful pupils he had ever taught. She made her concert debut in Vienna where she was received with enthusiastic acclaim. She appeared in joint recitals with other outstanding musicians. Thereafter she appeared with such leading symphony orchestras as those of Vienna, Budapest, and Warsaw. She was also featured at the Versailles Festival of the Beethoven Festival and was three times soloist at the Salzburg Festival. She is coming to the United States with Miss Hajos has given over 1000 recitals including those of the Philadelphia Orchestra, St. Patrick's Cathedral, and the Ethical Cultural Society, New York.

Bonds and stamps of all denominations have been and will continue to be sold from the booth every day, immediately after first period class on the second floor opposite the main stairway and during lunch period in the cafeteria.

Following a letter received by Dr. Wightman, a letter sent out by the government to all college and university presidents, requesting him to put on a drive, the executive council, comprised of the faculty members, met, and chose Miss Rena Key to head the program.

She conferred with Mr. Robert E. Williams who suggested that the measure be introduced before the members of the Student Government Association. It was approved. Members for the War Bond Committee were chosen.

The committee has planned to have a different student in charge of the booth and the sales each day. The booth was made by Dorothea Van Duzer and Kathleen Francis, Juniors. Kathleen will appoint the student of the day.

Chairman of the War Bond Committee is Audrey Furst, Freshman, assisted by Ruth Simpson, Senior, publicity chairman; Jean Gederman, Freshman, posters and advertising; Marvin Resnick, Freshman, treasurer whose duties will be to keep a sufficient supply of stamps and bonds purchased from the post office on hand; Isabelle Kanis, accelerated Sophomore; and Kathleen Francis and Dorothea Van Duzer, Juniors. The S.G.A. delegated some of these students where as others were chosen so that each class would be represented.

Not only will Staters be helping in the Fourth War Loan Drive but by being able to make purchases here in college, both they and the faculty have been provided a convenient and time-saving method.

A total of \$750 worth of defense bonds and stamps was sold Monday, January 10, the first day of State's War Bond and Stamps Drive, it was learned from Marvin Resnick, treasurer.
