MINUTES OF THE DECEMBER 3, 2005, DECEMBER 10, 2005 AND FEBRUARY 8, 2006 BOARD MEETINGS:

The minutes of the December 3, 2005, December 10, 2005 and February 8, 2006 Board meetings were approved as distributed.

CHAIR'S REPORT:

Mr. Taylor reported that the Board has engaged in a year long process to review the Mission Statement and its derivative goals and objectives. As a result of the public Board retreat in February, the Board agreed that each trustee would propose five (5) measurable outcomes of these goals and objectives that best represent their priorities for the University. That process should be completed for discussion at the May or June Board meetings.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

1. Dr. Speert introduced Dr. Edward Weil, selected as the new Provost and Senior Vice President for Academic Affairs as a result of a comprehensive national search. Upon approval of the Board, Dr. Weil will begin on March 20, 2006. Dr. Weil was welcomed with a round of applause.

- 2. President Speert acknowledged and mentioned the faculty approved for tenure effective September 1, 2006, who were invited to the meeting and a luncheon to follow with the Board in recognition of their achievement.
- 3. The President announced that the William Paterson University men's basketball team advanced to the NCAA Division III regional finals.
- 4. President Speert spoke about the state budget. The Governor has scheduled a Budget Summit for March 13, bringing together all constituencies. We are in the last year of a state negotiated contract which requires \$5.5 million in salaries, up from \$2 \$3 million, this year. Meeting that obligation will be difficult without sufficient state support. The Governor will deliver his budget message on March 21.
- 5. President Speert asked VP John Martone to report on our Alcohol.edu initiative. Dr. Martone spoke about this web-based intervention program aimed at helping to educate students about responsible drinking. We hosted a program recently attended by over 60 educators, law enforcement personnel, and high school counselors to introduce them to the Alcohol.edu program and to describe our efforts to help our students and collaborate with sending districts and other stakeholders.

Resolution 3-06-6 was unanimously adopted with the addition of the following wording, "subject to additional due diligence within the next 30 days."

Mr. Robert Bennett gave a brief presentation on the proposed plans for the Science Building. Dean DeYoung reported on the history of planning for the new Science and Health Building. A strategic planning process in the College of Science and Health designed to bring the science departments and health departments together with some common goals was initiated ten years ago. Two strategic directives were agreed upon – to provide an undergraduate research experience for as many students as possible, and to teach with active learning pedagogies and inquiry-based methodology. Many strides have been made in both areas. We are also now participating in Project Kaleidoscope, a nationwide initiative funded by the National Science Foundation to find new ways of teaching science and mathematics and to promote the creation of facilities that support the education process. Professor Marty Hahn, the "project shepherd" for the new Science facility, spoke about the vision statement developed by the project team with the input from each of the department heads involved. He described the process undertaken by the team and the resulting plan which includes both renovation of the existing structure and the building of a new wing. This will contribute to the enhancement of the curriculum and the quality of education for our students. Mr. Bennett and VP Bolyai answered questions about financing the project.

Resolutions 3-06-7, 3-06-8, and 3-06-10 were unanimously adopted.

Resolution 3-06-9 was unanimously adopted with a change replacing "Democracy Works" with "Enterprising Women."

INSTITUTIONAL DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE:

Mr. Fred Gruel reported that Kelly Christiansen, the new Director of Major Gifts and Planned Giving, was introduced to the Committee at its meeting on February 21, 2006. The Clark Terry Concert Hall project was discussed. We are seeking support and input from various contacts in the music industry. We are approaching the end of the Capital Campaign, which exceeded its original goal of \$25M by over \$5M. Plans for the silent phase of the next campaign are underway. The Legacy Awards Dinner is scheduled for April 8, 2006 at The Villa, Mountain Lakes, NJ.

MINORITY AFFAIRS COMMITTEE & STUDENT AFFAIRS COMMITTEE:

Dr. Henry Pruitt reported on the joint meeting of the Minority Affairs and Student Affairs Committees. A report was given on the Student Development retreat held in January at which they focused on the Student Success Plan. An update was given on Alcohol.Edu program. Students from three surrounding states came to WPU for an introduction to the program. The response was favorable and our students who participated in Alcohol.Edu also felt the program was valuable. A report was provided on the University's support of Women-owned business enterprises, Minority-owned business enterprises, and Small business enterprises (WBE/MBE/SBE). Dr. Pruitt reported that the architect for the Science Building project was informed that the University encourages the use of WBE/MBE/SBE firms whenever possible. Mr. Mazzola commented that he participated in part of the Student Development retreat and commended Dr. Martone and his team on the motivation and energy on behalf of serving our students better.
