MINUTES

MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE WILLIAM PATERSON UNIVERSITY OF NEW JERSEY

Thursday, June 20, 2024

The meeting was called to order at 9:00 a.m. in the 1800 Valley Road Board Room. Trustees were both in attendance and participating via a virtual platform.

ANNOUNCEMENT CONCERNING ADEQUATE NOTICE OF MEETING:

In accordance with the "Open Public Meetings Act," the Chairperson publicly announced and had entered into the minutes that adequate notice of this meeting was provided. In compliance with the Statute, this notice was posted in advance on the University's web page and distributed to The Herald News, The Record, and The Star Ledger more than 48 hours prior to this meeting.

It was moved and seconded to adopt the following resolution: RESOLUTION 6-24-1, TO MOVE INTO EXECUTIVE SESSION

The resolution was unanimously adopted.

At approximately 10:52 a.m., the Public Session resumed.

Chair Michael Seeve welcomed everyone to the in-person and virtual meeting. He thanked members of the University community who have participated in the governance of the University by attending the Board meeting and reported that the Board did not have a request for public comment. Mr. Seeve then read the University's Land Acknowledgment statement. <u>APPROVAL OF MINUTES MARCH 8, 2024, BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING</u>:

The minutes of the March 8, 2024, Board Meeting were approved as distributed.

Chair Seeve thanked everyone who was in attendance in person. He stated that

Dr. Helldobler continues to keep the Board apprised of campus happenings and the wonderful accomplishments of faculty, staff, and students. The board continues to carefully monitor enrollments and the budget as we plan for the University's future.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

President Helldobler thanked Mr. Seeve for his report. He noted that his full report, with recent accomplishments of the faculty, staff, and students since the last Board meeting, is included in the meeting materials. Dr. Helldobler encouraged everyone to read the full report. Dr. Helldobler then proceeded to recognize several members of the William Paterson Community who, this year, received the State Employee Recognition Awards as presented by the Office of the Governor. Six William Paterson University employees were among those honored by Governor Philip Murphy for their exceptional performance and service at a New Jersey State Employee Recognition Day (SERD) Award Ceremony in Trenton on May 9. The ceremony was held to recognize and honor state government employees for their outstanding contributions, a work ethic that inspires accomplishment, and their commitment to excellence in public service. The six employees honored were Johanna Prado, Amanda Vasquez, Kara Rabbitt, Daisy Rodriguez, Steve Quinn, and Jason Hunter.

Dr. Helldobler highlighted some of the accomplishments that have been achieved since he became President of William Paterson University on July 1, 2018. He noted that enrollment remains our number one challenge. We have seen improvement in the last couple of years – especially in the online space. Dr. Helldobler stated that we must remain laser-focused on creating the right mix of on-campus students (i.e., traditional undergraduates) while remaining aggressive in the graduate, adult-completer, and dual-enrollment markets, as well as with our newer initiatives in the international market. He said we have a multi-year plan for this which we will share with the Board in September.

Dr. Helldobler stated that four- and six-year graduation rates have underperformed due, in part, to the pandemic. We have developed a four- and six-year cohort dashboard that will show clearly what the obstacles are and how to take corrective action during the registration period. He also spoke about improving the Student Engagement KPI, the operating budget cut actions and institutional positions to meet these challenges.

Dr. Helldobler noted that we must avoid further layoffs in order to continue meeting our critical educational mission to service our students.

Dr. Helldobler presented a slide presentation with five years of accomplishments under the Board's leadership. He presented the ways we are attracting and retaining more students and ensuring that William Paterson delivers on affordability and value. He stated that we created the Pledge 4 Success to cover the unmet needs of qualifying students with the most significant financial need and to cap tuition and fee costs for many more families. The State of New Jersey used this program as the model for its own Garden State Guarantee program, which Governor Murphy announced during a visit on campus.

In the past five years, we closed a major student scholarship campaign, beating our \$10 million dollar goal by 60 percent and raising \$16 million dollars to increase and expand scholarship support for more students. In fiscal year 24, we awarded 779 scholarships totaling approximately \$1.66 million dollars, both exceeding our goals. That is 25% more scholarships delivering approximately 50% more dollar support than was available to our students five years ago in his first year as President. We received two substantial gifts to name Barbara Moll Grant Hall and Hennings Hall East, with additional naming gifts for the Martini Electronic Resource Center, Steve Adzima Strength and Conditioning Center, Alan J. Anderson Baseball Locker Room, and the Ginny Overdorf Tennis Courts.

One of our most important and persistent undertakings over his tenure has been building a strong foundation of student support. We reinvented the first-year experience with Will. Power. 101 and 102 to better meet the needs of our first-time, full-time population and teach these students how to succeed in college and improve retention, as a result. Additionally, Student Success Teams were implemented and the University shifted to professional staff advisors while beginning to provide critical, discipline-specific support to students through our Facultyas-Mentor model. We are also implementing a new University Core Curriculum, which builds on the fundamental excellence of our educational offerings while focusing it through a contemporary framework to provide students with a series of learning experiences unified by a social justice lens and the teaching of social mobility skills. The new UCC will enhance the student experience and increase the value of their degree and their employability. Dr. Helldobler spoke about the many other ways we are supporting the diverse needs of our students through the new Pioneer Pantry, U-Will Health Services program with expanded physical and mental health resources, the gains in creating a more diverse, equitable, inclusive, and just University which includes a new Chief Diversity Officer Dr. Jeanne Arnold, the Center for Diversity and Inclusion, the Black Cultural Center and the Center for Latinidad. We launched the President's Diversity Lecture series, and campus-wide work on decolonization. Dr. Helldobler stated that he was honored to receive the American Council on Education's Reginald Wilson Diversity Award.

He highlighted our new branding "Powerhouse of Progress" campaign and the many great strides in defining and promoting it to prospective students and families and key external audiences. He also mentioned new elements such as the new University mascot Pio and our new spirit song.

He spoke about our campus improvements at Hunziker Hall, Skyline Resident Hall, 1800 Valley Road, Wayne Dining Hall, Morrison Hall, the Recreation Center, and the Field House.

Dr. Helldobler stated that one of the greatest achievements is WP Online and how, in less than four years since launching, it has gone from 0 to 3,600 students in a diverse suite of graduate and undergraduate degree and certificate programs. He shared the growth of the School of Nursing and how it will help us further leverage our position to create new opportunities for William Paterson and our students, including partnerships and collaboration agreements like

the one we recently announced with Atlantic Health. He spoke about how we have forged new local, regional, and global partnerships that are creating opportunities for students and faculty at William Paterson and at partner institutions, as well as for prospective students, and others. A few examples include international agreements in South Korea, China, and elsewhere.

Dr. Helldobler presented and described in detail our career development outcomes, our social rankings including the most influential (U.S. News & World Report).

During the State of the University address at Shea, Dr. Helldobler told the campus community that he is grateful for all the good leadership that is occurring at every level of the University, including the faculty, staff, and students; the Union and Faculty Senate leadership; members of the Cabinet; Academic and Staff Leadership; members of the Foundation Board, Alumni Executive Council, and – of course – all of you, the members of our Board of Trustees. These collective accomplishments are the result of hard work and commitment from every area of the University with their leadership and support, and their willingness to take bold risks that have been critical to all the successes.

This concluded Dr. Helldobler's report and presentation.

Each Trustee in attendance commented positively on President Helldobler's achievements and thanked him for his leadership, his focus, and his ability to engage problems and make decisions. They also commended his focus during Covid, strides on enrollment, his focus on diversity, WP Online and his forward thinking. He was also applauded for assembling a topnotch cabinet team.

CHAIR OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES' REPORT

Mr. Seeve thanked President Helldobler on behalf of the Board for providing this thorough and detailed overview of many the accomplishments achieved during these past six years of his presidency at William Paterson. He stated that the President has consistently met and, in many cases, exceeded the annual goals. The Executive Committee and the full Board have completed multiple annual performance evaluations, and they continue to be pleased because Dr. Helldobler has consistently provided innovative and insightful leadership and he is establishing the University as a leading institution in the State of New Jersey, delivering quality education to the future leaders of the nation. President Helldobler has also exercised exemplary financial stewardship. The Executive Committee has recommended to the Board of Trustees that the President be given a multi-year contract through to June 30, 2029.

RESOLUTION 6-24-2, Presidential Contract for action by the Board was moved by Mr. Guarasci and seconded by Mr. Gruel.

Mr. Seeve updated everyone about the changes with our student Trustees. He first said goodbye to Kourtney Scipio, who served for two years as a student Trustee.

RESOLUTION 6-24-3, Honoring Student Trustee, Kourtney Scipio was moved by

He stated the necessity to be bold and proactive in response to the FAFSA and state aid delays, with the intent to simplify the process for families. He noted that WP Online continues to be a source of degree-seeking growth, and that dual enrollment continues to grow. He further noted the division's focus on yield and summer melt.

Dr. Kacenga took the Board through the Fall 2024 goals. He said our overall university headcount goal is 11,967 and we are currently at 6,724 and on track to meet the goals. The main campus goal is 7,711 and we are just over 4,600. For WP Online, the goal is 4,256 and are at 2,084. There is a lot of summer left, and he is confident about where we are based on historical trends at William Paterson. He noted the distinction for full-time undergraduate main campus and how the goal is 4,611 and right now we are at 3,249. For WP Online, the goals are a little over a thousand, and we are at 467. For the main campus, continuing students, their goal is to have 4,166 and they are approaching that at 3,445. For WP Online continuing students, the goal is 2,402, and they are at 1,524. Dr. Kacenga noted the positive number of deposits and stated that not all programs require deposits. Our new student's overall goal is to reach 5,399, and they are at 2,104 and noted the shift in numbers once non-degree seeking students were removed from the headcount. He stated that they have reached their goal for full-time first-time deposits for the Fall 2024 goal, which is a huge accomplishment, and he also thanked Stephen Quinn, Associate Vice President of Admissions, for his and his team's work. Dr. Kacenga gave a snapshot of where we are as of today. We have 15,534 applications this Fall, a 17% increase over last year. For accepted students, they have 11,380, a 16.3% increase over this time last year. He stated that they have 2,217 deposits that have been paid, an increase of 8.2% over this time last year, and 2,104 who are enrolled.

He reviewed the Fall 2024 enrollment imperatives and reviewed slides presented in the Board Committee meetings, such as the first-time full-time retention comparisons in cohorts, demographics, and colleges.

UNIVERSITY STRATEGIC PLAN UPDATE

Vice President Guillermo de Veyga reported that the committees were all briefed on the progress of the strategic plan. All strategic plan updates will be posted on the website. Hearing no questions, this concluded his report.

GOVERNMENT AND COMMUNITY AFFAIRS REPORT:

Vice President de Veyga mentioned that his full report is included in the board packet stating that a large part of it was centered on the budget negotiations in Trenton. For instance, the \$7.5 million that is on the table right now and the \$4 million dollar request for the enhancement of our nursing pipeline. Dr. de Veyga also proceeded to discuss some of the bills including one which pertains to the established academic credit and reverse credit transfer standards and establish the New Jersey Transfer Ombudsman.

Mr. Seeve commented that it was comforting to know that Dr. de Veyga is on the front lines of these important initiatives.

Ms. Zastocki and seconded by Mr. Gruel.

Mr. Seeve stated that Jason Peralta will move from the non-voting student Trustee role to the voting role, and he looks forward to his continued excellent work in the upcoming year. Mr. Seeve introduced us to our newly elected Student Trustee, Xavier Clavijo. He will officially join the Board in September as the non-voting student Trustee and will be a member of the Education Policy and Student Development Committee.

Mr. Seeve proceeded with his report and informed us that the Board Committees met on June 6, 2024, and they heard from the Vice-Presidents and other members of the University community who provide updates on various items. The Finance, Audit, and Institutional Development Committee met with Internal Auditor Ms. Ellen Caravella and CIO Gamin Bartle. They heard a report from the University's outside auditors, Baker Tilly, reviewed the services they will provide in the upcoming year, and the committee authorized signing Baker Tilly's engagement letter. The committee heard reports from several Vice Presidents, including Chief Financial Officer Kirsten Loewrigkeit, who reviewed bid waivers followed by updates from Cabinet members on the implementation of the Strategic Plan, as well as reports from Enrollment Management and Institutional Advancement. The Educational Policy and Student Development Committee heard a presentation from Academic Affairs regarding new certificate programs, an undergraduate track conversion to a program, and a new graduate program. The Personnel Committee also met; their discussions are confidential. The Nominations and Governance Committee met and heard an update on the state of affairs in the New Jersey government.

This concluded his report.

Chief of Staff to the President and Board of Trustees Loretta Mc Laughlin Vignier reported that on April 19, 2024, the Executive Committee acted on Resolution 4-24-1E, found in the Board packets on page 18. The Resolution approves the Bid Waiver for LHH and LHH Recruitment, LLC for temporary personnel costs. It was presented for informational purposes. This concluded her report.

FALL 2024 ENROLLMENT OUTLOOK AND RETENTION UPDATE

Vice President for Enrollment Management, George Kacenga provided a Fall enrollment outlook and retention update. He stated that with the unprecedented situation regarding FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid), the University is fortunate to have Stacy-Ann Brown, who is in her first year in the role as Director of Financial Aid, and she has risen to the occasion as a leader in this area. He also informed the Board of the various strategies concerning the timing of financial aid packages. Enrollment Management has been nurturing the growth of WP online dual enrollment, revamping admissions events, and noted how helpful the Navigate app has been to students. He also thanked Vice President of Marketing, Stuart Goldstein for his leadership on the new Powerhouse branding campaign.

Dr. Kacenga continued his report by presenting the factors influencing enrollment for Fall 2024.

FINANCE, AUDIT, AND INSTITUTIONAL DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE REPORT:

Trustee Linda Niro delivered this report on behalf of Trustee Kevin Lenahan. She stated that the Finance, Audit, and Institutional Development Committee met on Thursday, June 6, 2024. Prior to the meeting, the Audit Committee met with the Internal Auditor, Ms. Ellen Caravella, and Chief Information Officer Gamin Bartle. She stated that they have continued their practice of regularly meeting with the Chief Information Officer regarding cyber security risk assessment and processes to ensure campus systems are protected. The committee heard from Andrea Caladie and Joseph Renzi of Baker Tilly Virchow Krause, the University's external auditors, who provided the committee with an overview of the services Baker Tilly will provide as part of their auditing services. She stated that following their presentation, the committee authorized Vice President of Finance and Administration and Chief Financial Officer Kirsten Loewrigkeit to sign the Baker Tilly engagement letter. Ms. Loewrigkeit then presented the All-Funds Revenues and Expenses Report, the expected results for the fiscal year 2024, and the preliminary budget for the fiscal year 2025. Ms. Niro stated that the committee also heard reports regarding the Fall 2024 enrollment outlook and retention update, an institutional advancement progress report, and an update on the Strategic Plan.

The FAID committee agreed to move the following six resolutions to the full board for approval.

Ms. Niro thanked Dr. Helldobler and the cabinet members for their work and presentations at the meeting earlier this month. This concludes her committee report.

EDUCATIONAL POLICY AND STUDENT DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE REPORT

Trustee William Pesce began the report by stating that the committee met on June 6, 2024, and heard presentations from several Cabinet members on Enrollment, Retention, a Strategic Plan update, and an update on curriculum from Provost Powers and Associate Provost Jonathan Lincoln.

The committee had three resolutions to move forward to the full Board for consideration.

It was moved by Ms. Niro and then seconded by Mr. Galandak to adopt the following resolution: RESOLUTION 6-24-10, On the Initiation of Undergraduate and Graduate Certificates

The resolution was unanimously adopted.

It was moved by Mr. Galandak then seconded by Ms. Rodriguez to adopt the following resolution:

The resolution was unanimously adopted.

Mr. Pesce expressed his appreciation to everyone who presented at the meeting as well as those who helped to prepare the materials. He stated it was one of the most encouraging and positive progress reports received in a while. This concluded his report.

PERSONNEL AND COMPENSATION COMMITTEE REPORT:

Trustee Bradley Neilley reported that the Personnel and Compensation Committee also met on Thursday, June 6th. The meeting is open to all Board and Cabinet members involved in personnel decisions. The Committee heard reports from Cabinet members on enrollment and retention and an update on the Strategic Plan implementation.

The committee had one resolution to move forward to the full Board for consideration.

It was moved by Ms. Niro and then seconded by Mr. Galandak to adopt the following resolution: RESOLUTION 6-24-13, Various Personnel Matters (Consent Agenda)

The resolution was unanimously adopted.

NOMINATIONS AND GOVERNANCE COMMITTEE

Trustee Galandak reported that the Committee met on Thursday, June 6, 2024. The committee received an update from Vice President de Veyga on pending bills in the state legislature that could affect higher educational institutions. He stated that the committee has no motions to move forward to the full board for approval. This concluded his report.

OTHER BUSINESS:

Mr. Seeve thanked all the committee chairs and advised that the next Board meeting will take place on Friday, September 20, 2024. At this time, Mr. Seeve asked if the trustees had any other business. Ms. Rodriguez congratulated and acknowledged Trustee Guarasci and Trustee Niro for their 15 years of service on the Board of Trustees.

Hearing no other business or comments, the meeting was adjourned at 12:35 pm.
