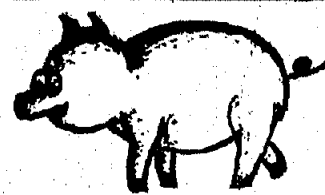

Concrete to replace grass

The college plans to cover all areas of its campus, that are showing soil instead of grass, with concrete, said Reichstag Hindenburg, director of College Misinformation. The cost of the project will be an estimated \$700,000, which will come from the tickets given to law-breaking citizens of the campus.

"Too many students, faculty members, staff and visitors do not use the concrete walkways the campus provides and opt to walk on the beautiful grass landscape," said Porky Spareribs, minister of Greenbacks and Finance. "The college administration will no longer tolerate this irresponsi-

ble and damaging act and will begin to fine all people who walk on the grass."

The college will hire a new security firm to make sure everyone abides by the new rule, Hindenburg said. Anyone caught walking on the grass, any grass on campus, will be required to pay a \$200 fine. If the person refuses to pay the fine, they will be sentenced to 1,000 hours of community service to the college.

"We feel this is a great step forward for William Paterson," Hindenburg said. "This will show visitors that we care about our grass and will not put up with any enjoyment of it."

Jackbilt D. House, president of Stoned Architects Inc., said he wants to present an idea to

President Arnie Sneer that five-foot high fences be placed in front of the most frequently used grass-way.

Any vehicle driving on the paved sidewalks will have the right-of-way to pedestrians and is instructed to hit them rather than drive on the grass, Hindenburg said.

Study says beeper wearers insecure about sexual ability

The WPC Department of Phallic Studies has recently released a study which links men who carry beepers and men who are insecure about their sexual organs' size and/or aptitude.

"It's very simple," said Wadsworth P. Longfellow, chair of the department and co-writer of the study. Parking problem solved with opening of new lot

A new solution to the continuing saga of campus parking problems has been found, said Minister of College Misinformation Reichstag Hindenburg. President Arnie Sneer announced the new solution Friday after a student discovered a buried car, Hindenburg said.

Jimmy Hoffa's body found

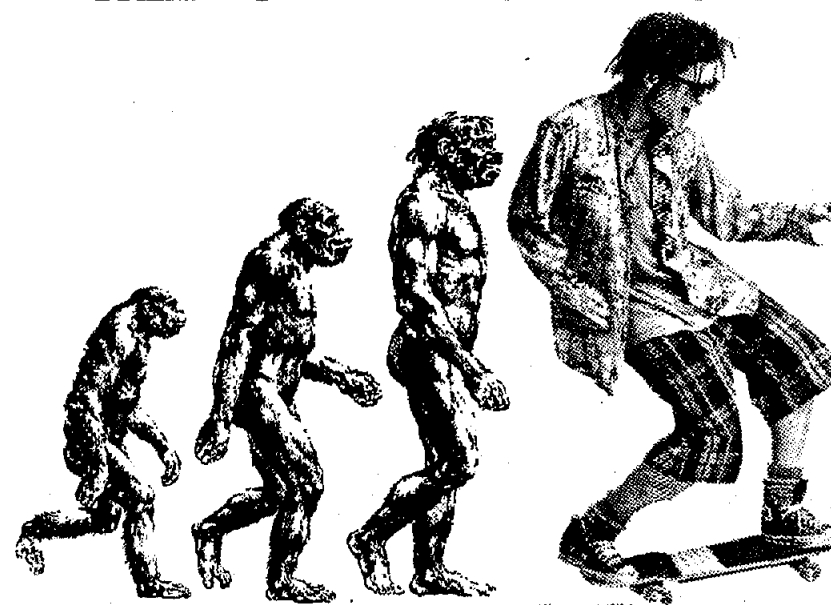
"I think its great, even though my tank of a car will not be able to park here," said political bull major Lincoln M. Ford. "It's about time someone did something about this problem."

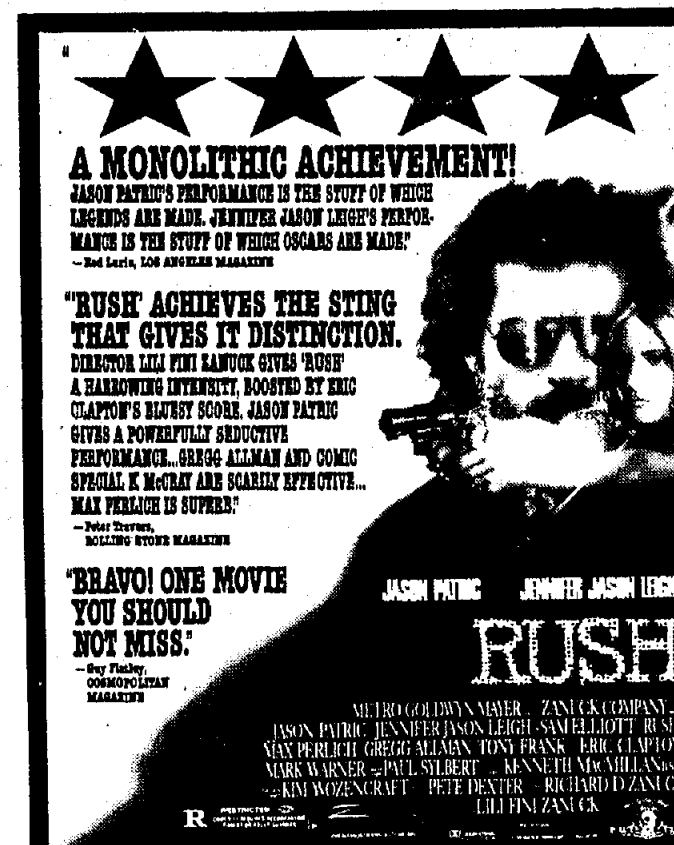

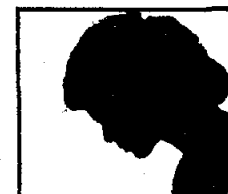
