College to hire replacement players

In a surprising move, WPC college president, Arnold Speert has announced that he will "not negotiate with striking unions" and will be hiring replacement baseball players to fill the vacant slots.

The colleges five unions walked out on June 1 when negotiations over a new contract collapsed. The unions had been working without a contract for over six months and according to a representative "Just couldn't work anymore."

The move to strike did not come as a surprise to the college chief negotiator. "We saw it coming, especially when they started bringing games boys to the negotiating table."

The decision to hire the replacement baseball players, many of whom have been out of work since the baseball season resumed, was a difficult one. "The last thing I wanted to do was loose the fine people working at the college," said Speert. "However, the college has to be able to operate."

According to an administration source, the college also sees the hiring of the baseball players as a possible source of future revenue. "All I can say is that the college is currently investigating holding games and charging admission," the source told The Bacon.

"I am furious," said one union member. "What type of place is this and on top of that I can pitch better than most of those guys."

Most students interviewed seemed to be indifferent about the situation

"What's the difference" said one student, "I generally sleep in class anyway."

The players will be coming from as far away as Quebec. Besides their extensive knowl-

College is situated on the site of the family estate of Garret A. Hobart the twenty-fourth vice president of the United States. A finer historical location Disney could not have hoped for." The colleges close proximity to New York City and a number of New Jerseys major cities also helped convince Disney

Although details still remain to be worked out, the college will be receiving an as yet undisclosed sum of money. Classes will continue as Disney feels they will give visitors a fine example of "outdated traditional teaching methods."

Slatted to open in 1997, the new theme park will be Disney's first venture in the area of historical theme parks.

Administration cracks whip on attendance

Citing the "need to improve class attendance," WPC interim provost Sue McNamara announced that departments would "begin enforcing a mandatory attendance policy."

According to the Student Handbook "Students are expected to attend regularly and punctually all classes, laboratory periods and other academic exercises."

"Obviously the current policy is not working," she said. McNamara pointed to a study done by the Office of Planning, Research and Evaluation. The six month study took nearly two

years to finish, but according to McNamara, "It was well worth the wait." The study showed that among Juniors and Seniors, "less than 50 percent attended class regularly." Among freshmen and sophomores, that number increases only slightly to 61 percent. "How do expect teachers to teach when on a given day they may have only half a class," McNamara said.

"I don't mind not having a full class," said one teacher from the History Department. "I can read and drink coffee and get to know my students on a more personal level."

The enforcement method listed in the new policy has provoked wide reaction The policy states "all students who do not attend classes will be publicly whipped."

"Can they really do that?" asked one bewildered student. "What type of whip are they going to use?" asked another.

In response to the charge that the punishment is too drastic, not to mention unconstitutional, McNamara said, "If that is what it is going to take to get people to do what they should be doing on their own, then that is what we will do. Do I think it is to drastic? No, we are here to teach about democracy not practice it." As f r unconstitutional, McNamara

Certain departments have been testing the new policy for a while now. One student who was whipped after missing just one class, thinks the policy is a good one. "It whipped me into shape," he said.

The whippings will be carried about by Department Chairs many of whom welcomed the opportunity to "do something on campus." The college has contracted the Pleasure Chest in New York City to supply the whips. The whippings will be carried out in the Bill Pat's Pub in the student center during bad weather and on pleasant days in front of the student center.

"I think the situation will be beneficial for everyone," McNamara said. "It might sting a little at first but it's the end


"I figured if I had the balls to get my nipples

days till summer.


Other accomplishments include volleyball courts for night playing and basketball courts for "imagination ball."

Funding needs lead to creative fundraising



The Biology Department unveiled its chief fund raising tool for the Fall semester on Thursday, a thirty foot high marijuana plant.

The plant, a Northern Lights #5 crossbred with a super-potent Skunk strain, will be harvested in early October and sold to the public soon thereafter. All WPC students, with valid student I.D., will receive an additional ten percent discount off of the already low prices offered.

The money raised through the

sales will be used, in part, to purchase fetal pigs and frogs for dissection in class. The majority of the funds, though, will go towards obtaining a high power. centrifuge.

The plant was raised with the help of an experimental plant growth hormone, developed at WPC. Its effects are evident. After only three months, the department had to cut an opening in the roof of the greenhouse, located behind the Science building, to allow the plant to continue to grow.

Seeds from the plant will also

be sold to anyone who wishes to grow their own at home. One hundred seeds will be offered for ten dollars and the buds from the plant will be sold in oneeighth ounce increments. Oneeighth ounce will be thirty dollars, one-quarter ounce will sell for fifty-five dollars, one-half ounce will cost one-hundred dollars, and a full ounce will go for one-hundred-ninety dollars.

Demand for the product will be high so advance orders are being taken. Anyone interested should contact the Biology Department.

"We just went up there with a bong, a quarter ounce, and a case of Budwiser to knock it all down," said WPC Head Toker Kerry Kindbud.


No winner was determined at the event.

"Sandy definitely gave us stability on the mound," WPC


"Without her, we would have been lost. My 'Strat-O-Matic' team finished in first place this
