WPC Student Center to be renamed by corporate sponsor

Claiming that rising costs have left them with "no choice," William Paterson College officials announced this week that the Student Center would be renamed that **Taco Bell Center**. The change came after the Corporation made an undisclosed donation to the college.

In a press release, the company cited their "close ties to the students stomachs and minds," as the impetus for the donation.

The donation, the first of it's kind at WPC is to be used to help start a culinary program. "We believe in fine food, for fine people," said company president.

Additionally, no other types of foods will be sold on campus except for Taco Bell and it's subsidiaries.

Similar arrangements have been made at other colleges and universities.

As to whether this is the beginning of a trend at WPC, Arnold Speert, college president would only say, "Well, how much do you got?"

WPC Annex to house Rowan College courses and studio

College officials have revealed that design of the new academic building on campus had a purpose other than aesthetic. The new building will house Rowan Colleges School of Engineering Shipbuilding program.

Rowan's School of Engineering, was created as the result of a 100 million donation, which also brought about a change in the schools name from Glassboro College. That facilities that will eventually house the school and still under construction and will not be completed in time for the school year.

WPC President Arnold Speert said "I am pleased that we will be able to assist out sister institution during their time of need."

Members of the community were also pleased about the decision.

"I actually had no idea what the building one," said one WPC Dean. "I thought it was possibly an airplane hanger, guess I was wrong."

Actually Speert revealed the initial plans for the building included a brewery hence the "tall" design.

WPC to focus on morse code

Provost arrested

The William Paterson College campus community is reeling from the arrest last Saturday night of Chernoh M. Sesay, WPC provost and vice-president for Academic Affairs.

Sesay, who came to WPC in February, was arrested when WPC Campus Police responded to a call from the Heritage Hall Resident Hall Resident Director of an individual activating the fire alarms.

Area fire departments had refused to respond after supposedly being summoned for three false alarms in a two hour period.

Upon arrival, according to police officials, Sesay was found sitting atop an empty beer keg beneath a "pulled" fire alarm box. Allegedly, Sesay was part of a group of students playing the children's game "Red Light, Green Light." Further investigation also revealed that Sesay was the organizer of a party that had occurred earlier in the evening.

"It was a complete mess," said one officer, "there were students passed out everywhere, puddles of beer and vomit. It was a gosh darn war scene."



According to reports, as he was led away in handcuffs, Sesay kept repeating "I figured out how to keep retention up! The students, they'll stay!"

Witnesses reported that at approximately 8 p.m. that evening, Sesay, who has been living in the residence hall while looking for a house for his family, met an Anheiser Busch delivery truck in front of the building.

WPC president to resign

In a week that has been full of surprises, the sudden announcement

of the resignation of long-time William Paterson College President Arnold Speert did not shock many. His reason shocked everyone.

"I have decided after consulting with my wife and children to leave WPC and pursue my dream of becoming a Rockette," Speert said at a press conference on Tuesday.

His announcement shocked members of his staff who claimed that "they had no idea."

"I have been working for him for years," said assistant Lee Vadalla, "I didn't even know he could

According to friends close to the family, Speert had initially tried to pursue a dancing career during college but only got as far as a chorus

SGA to build dormitory

In a statement distributed to the entire campus community, William Paterson College Student Government Association President Alex Malino announced that the SGA would break ground this summer for a new high rise residence hall.

"We are tired of the colleges inability to properly maintain the dormitories," Malino wrote. "We don't think it is too much to ask for roofs that don't leak, floors that don't flood and elevators that really work."

Malino was referring to the two apartment style dormitories Heritage and Pioneer Halls and the Towers dormitory.

"The motto of the SGA is 'Here for you' and students have asked us to look into better housing," Malino explained in the memo. "We have spoken to our financial advisor and figured that the best thing we could do would be to build a building and maintain it ourselves."

Allegedly, the college had been negotiating with the SGA for the SGA to pick up the tab on a number of repairs that the college does not have the money to cover.

"It's not that we don't want to fix the problems, I even think we know how," said WPC

Resident Director, "But there is only so much money and we would rather use for new furniture and other eye pleasing projects."

According to the memo, the new SGA dormitory, to be named Freedom Hall, will have no visitation policy -- spouses and children welcomed. Additionally each of the one bedroom apartment style suites will feature full kitchens with dishwasher, microwave ovens and garbage disposals. The living rooms will have a computer hooked up to the college network as well as a full entertainment center including surround sound, laser disc and beta (just in case). Laundry service will also be available.

"We tried to think of everything," said Malino. "We want students to feel as special here as they do at home."

The new 20 story building will house 240 students and will be built on top of the site of the SGA volleyball court.

"It was rarely used for volleyball, and a logical site logistically speak," Malino said.

Valet parking will be another feature of the SGA hopes to offer.

WPC Campus Police lay down the law

Citing the current bruhaha over the parking ticket collection process, past difficulties with community relations and the continuing refusal by the William Paterson College Board of Trustees to let them carry weapons, WPC Campus Police have announced that they will no longer issue any types of tickets, nor make any arrests.

"We've had all we're going to take and we're not going to take anymore," said WPC Police Chief Pete Ryerson. "My men and woman work darn hard, and if this is how they are going to be treated well, fooley."

"We're disappointed by their actions and are investigating our legal stance," said WPC Vice-President of Administration and Finance Peter Spiridon. "But community members should be alarmed, I am leading a class through the policy academy and we will shortly be taking over their duties."

In addition to himself, the class is said to include, Tim Fanning, assistant vice-president for administration and finance, Rajendra Singh, assistant vice-president for human resources, Marc Schaeffer, executive assistant to the president, and Peter Ljutic, bursar.

Spiridon is also pleased that this class has more women than the current campus police force.

In actuality, there are three women on the roster for the WPC class, they are: Nancy Norville, dean of enrollment management, Diane Ackerman, acting director of financial aid and Pamela Fueshko, director of

telecommunications and administrative services.

The latest dispute involving campus police, regards attempts at collecting nearly 1 million dollars in outstanding parking tickets.

Community members have been outraged at the language used in a collection letter and the number of missbillings that have occurred.

"Actually, I am from New York City," said one faculty member and unpaid ticket-holder, "and in New York this type of strong-arm tactics goes on all the time."

"I'm not going to let you beat up on me or my people anymore," Ryerson told a Bacon reporter, "so shoo, I'm going to hunt turkeys. At least these I can shoot back at," he added.

As for concerns that lawlessness will rule over the campus during the time before the new "recruits" come on board, one campus police officer said, "Nah, nothing will change, students here don't realize the opportunities they have in front of them. Hah, we didn't even have locks on College Hall for three weeks and nothing happened."

The Student Government Association, which in the past has been supportive of the police in the past has been quite regarding this latest incident.

"I don't think it is our place to get involved," said one SGA member.

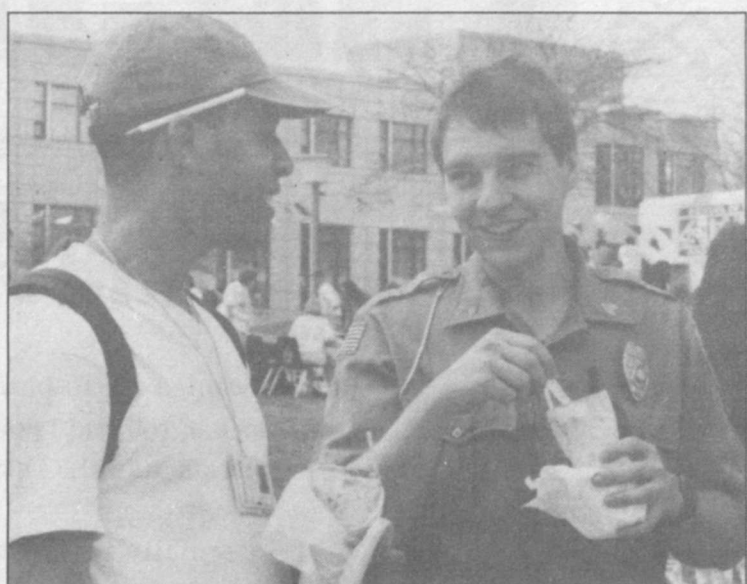
As to what the officers will do, since according to college officials, they will not be fired

nor removed from payroll, "They'll be a visible presence on campus," said a police union spokesman.

"We'll continue to work with the community, letting them know what we are and what policing is about and hopefully getting them to see our side."

As to whether or not they feel they are letting the campus community down he responded, "For a long time now we've been told to put up, put up and put up, it got to the point that our work was really beginning to suffer. We had to do something and a standard strike was not really the answer."

As for students, one female student said "I did not realize that behind the uniforms and badges, there were real people. Actually, they are kind of cute and cuddly, especially that

"You may be surprised, but I am pleased with how campus police have responded," said WPC president Arnold Speert, "rather than striking, they are

No discussions between the two parties are scheduled at this time.
