We began the last chapter of our four-year diary by sponsoring the Hi-Ya Hop—a "get-acquainted" dance for "old" Staters as well as new.


Time passed quickly when days were filled with practice teaching, yearbook preparations, and our trip to Washington, D. C.





From the Wings


