The officers and sport chairmen with the able guidance of Mildred Lee, their faculty advisor, have worked hard to keep an already active program progressing to even greater activity.



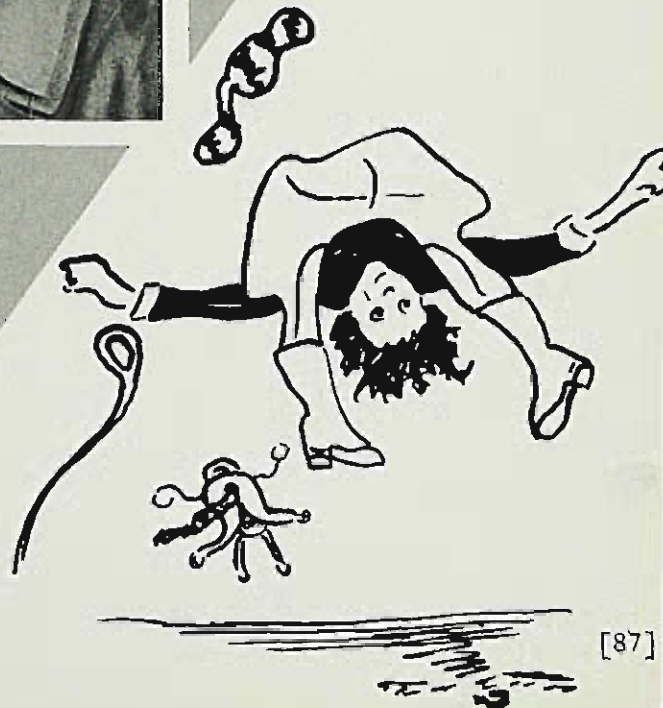
