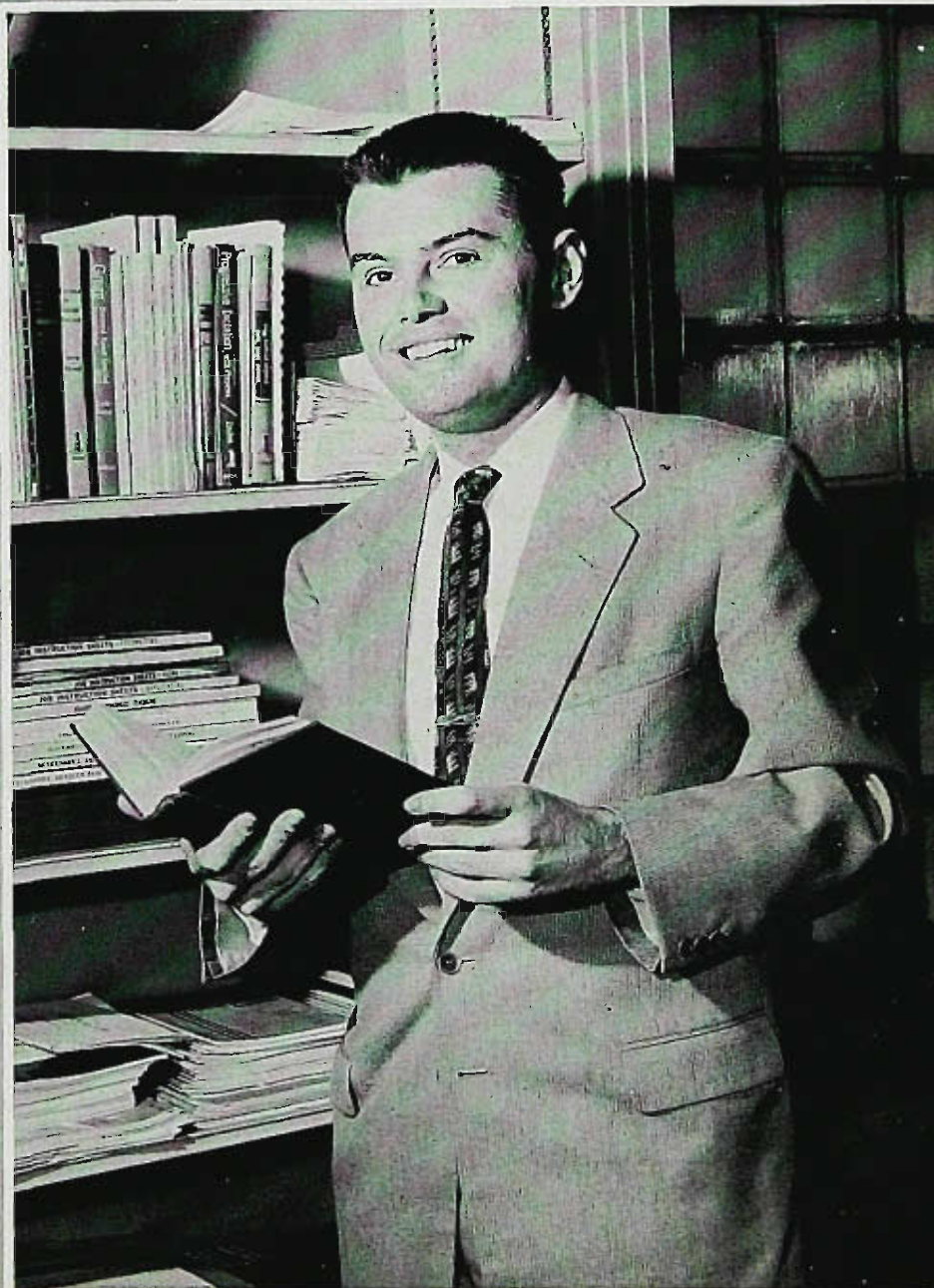

May your departure from our campus lead you with confidence renewed into the brightness of the future.

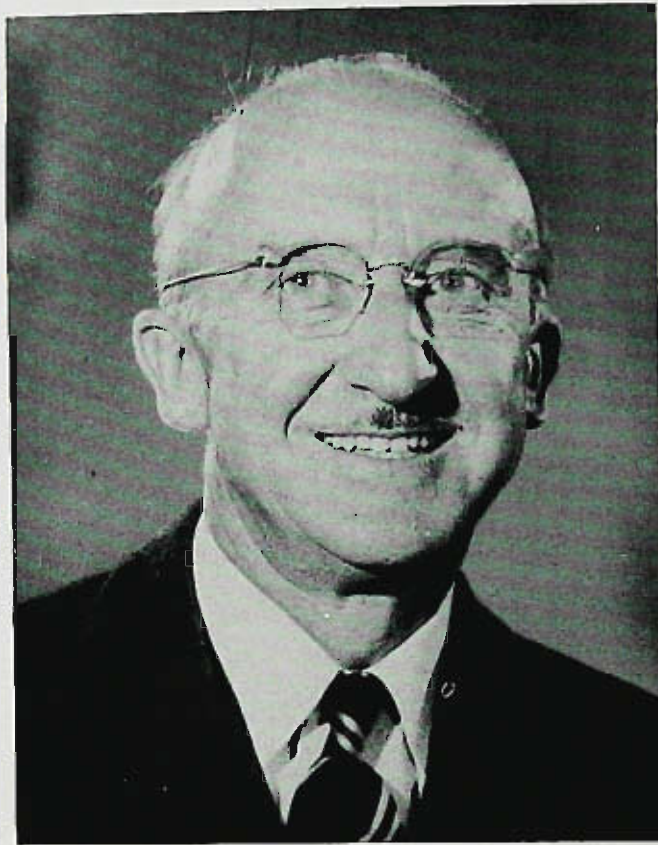

The late DR. SAMUEL P. UNZIKER

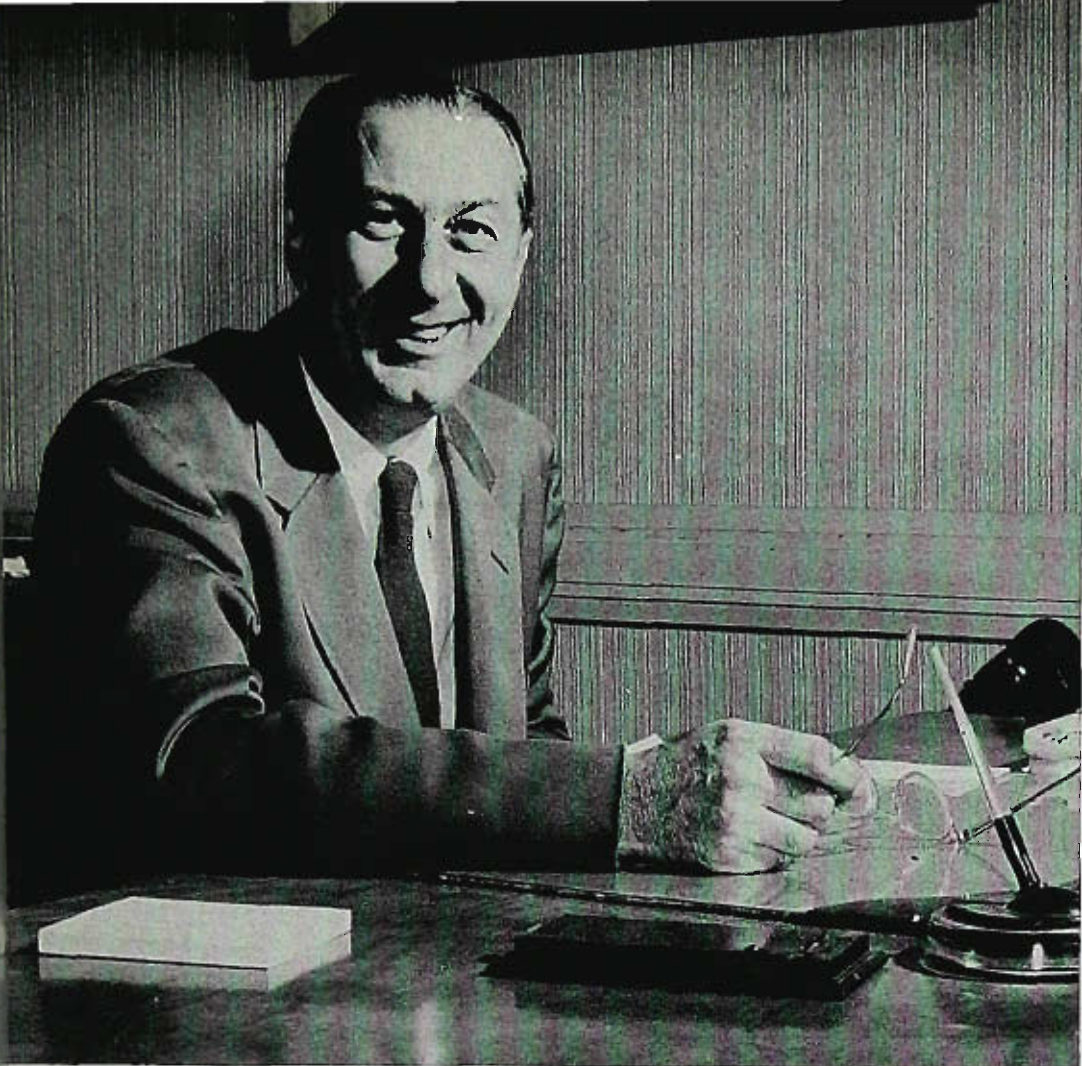
Owen Meredith in his poem "A Great Man" might have been describing Samuel P. Unziker, Ph.D., when he wrote:

## DEAN OF INSTRUCTION

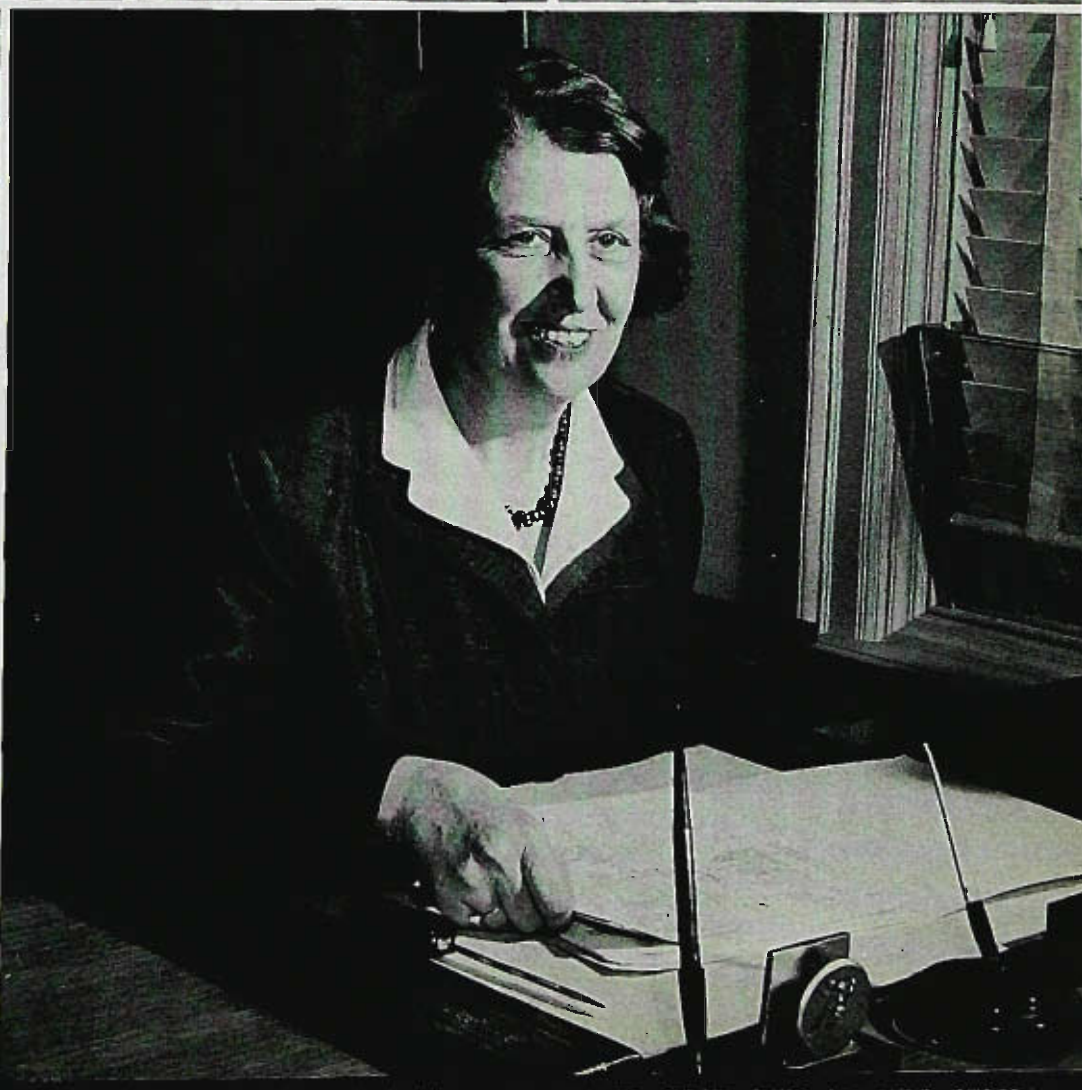
**KENNETH B. WHITE**
