
The Women's Recreation Association offers a wide variety of sports in which its members may participate. Among these are archery, basketball, bowling, softball, volleyball, and modern dance.



At the annual banquet in May, awards are distributed to those girls who have been active participants throughout the year. These awards are presented on the basis of accumulation of points based on a point system.



men's varsity fencing




varsity soccer
