
"There is nothing Nature loves so well as to change existing forms . . . "











Through involvement in a multitude of exp ences — study, class activities, clubs, stud government — true growth and change are veloped.


















For his efforts to advance the growth and welfare of Paterson State College and its students, we dedicate this yearbook to President James Karge Olsen.










Administration and Faculty



Change is the one constant. Paterson State College was in step with that constant in 1968-1969, a year of change for the College.

The fall term began with a full-time day enrollment in excess of 3500, the largest in the history of the College. Within that figure were 1252 new students on our campus. Sixty-six new faculty joined the staff in September, 1968. A new administration appeared on the scene. The Faculty Senate began its first full year. The Student Government pursued another responsible year.

We can say it was a year of accomplishment as the College strived to achieve its multi-purpose character and served those needing and desiring both arts and sciences and professional programs. New administrative posts, including vice-presidents and deans, and additional faculty positions were authorized. The building of the new Fine Arts Building was begun. Planning for a science complex, behavioral science building, college union and residence halls was completed. Efforts were made and are continuing to be made to fill, after the buildings just listed, the single most pressing need for the College, physical education and athletic facilities.

All groups of the College participated in two central issues involving the State of New Jersey, its government and the future of the College. They were the successful campaign for the November, 1968 Bond Issue which will enable about 7½ million dollars worth of capital improvements on our campus and the campaign for greater autonomy for the State Colleges, not only for the purpose of efficiency and economy, but to assure the integrity and identity of Paterson State College.

Above all, the college community evidenced greater awareness of its responsibilities to the society at large, a concern for the socially and economically disadvantaged. And, as the college seeks to accommodate hundreds of more students annually, it is giving testimony to the citizens of New Jersey that it is alert to the needs of the thousands of high school graduates in New Jersey who are educationally disadvantaged in that they do not have, compared to other states or commensurate with the capacities of the State, the opportunity for public higher education within New Jersey.

Yes, it has been a year of change – more importantly, a year of progress. Progress that has been responsibly achieved by all members of the Paterson State College community – students, faculty, trustees, alumni and administration. Kindly permit me to express my very sincere and profound gratitude to all who have participated in this year of change.

I extend the warmest congratulations to the Class of 1969 and the equally sincere hope that they will return to their College frequently in the years ahead.



Faculty Senate



S.G.A. General Council









Experiment in International Living






Cross Country




Ken Medaska scored his thirty-ninth goal and set a new school scoring record. He also led the team with four assists. Ken was chosen first string NJSCAC lineman for the third year in a row after receiving an "honorable mention" his freshman year.

Richard Furlong received the year's Dedication and Effort Award. He led the team in conference scoring, where the team compiled a 1-3-1 record.

The 1969 squad will be led into a fifteen-game schedule by newly elected co-captains Pete Santeusanio and Harold Ferrando. Next year's games will be played on a soccer field sodded and surrounded by a track and portable bleachers in a newly built outdoor athletic complex.







Varsity Basketball

The 1968-69 basketball season at Paterson State College began in optimism and ended with both fans and players alike downcast by the record. Although the team sometimes scored as many as 90 points a game, they ended with a 1-9 Conference record. However, the varsity roundballers averaged 81.1 points per games — a commendable offensive mark, and Tom Dilly and Dom Pelosi were bright spots in the season. Dilly once again led the team in scoring with a 16.2 average, while Pelosi was second at 11.6, playing his usual steady and aggressive game.

Dilly was particularly outstanding. He reached a personal peak when he went over the 1000 career point mark on February 6, 1969 against Genesee State. He went on to wind up with a total of 1071 points. Dilly was also the team's leading rebounder for the third year in a row, and was named to the third team of the New Jersey State College Conference All-Star squad.

Pete Lukach was another pleasant surprise in a dismal season. Sidelined for half of the year, Pete came on at the end to add his six-foot-four-inch height and inside maneuverability to the squad. He'll be back for the 69-70 season.

Pat O'Shea was named most valuable player due to his superb performance in the 200 yard individual medley and the 100 yard freestyle.






Senior Faculty Dinner
