Last year, almost every statement I made dealt in some manner with transformation, the fundamental change that was taking place at Paterson State College and drastically altering its identity. I find this year that the process of change has not abated; it has, indeed, accelerated. What we had last year was the start of this process, and what we face now is the implementation of the many goals that we have set for our college.

All this has had its focal point in you, the Paterson State student, and particularly, the graduating class of 1970. There is obvious symbolism here. This is the class that begins the decade of the seventies. For years you have been told that you will form the leadership in the decades ahead, and now that first decade is here, and you are about to confront it. I want to stress, incidentally, the Paterson State will remain your school, as you move now from student to alumnus, and I hope, continue an active interest in the development of the college.

The seventies, without doubt, will be unlike any decade we have known, just as the sixties, and the fifties and every decade in this century has had their singular identities. You are also unlike any college graduate we have known. Yes, one can find historical parallels in your sometimes deep dissatisfaction with some aspects of society and your impatience at the slowness of change. But no other generation of college graduates can match the sophistication and awareness which you, born into the electronic age, now take with you into the dawning seventies. You have impressive weapons in your intellectual arsenal, and a frightening responsibility to use them well to bring about that level of society which you have demanded. I believe you are up to the task and I offer you my sincerest congratulations on your achievement.

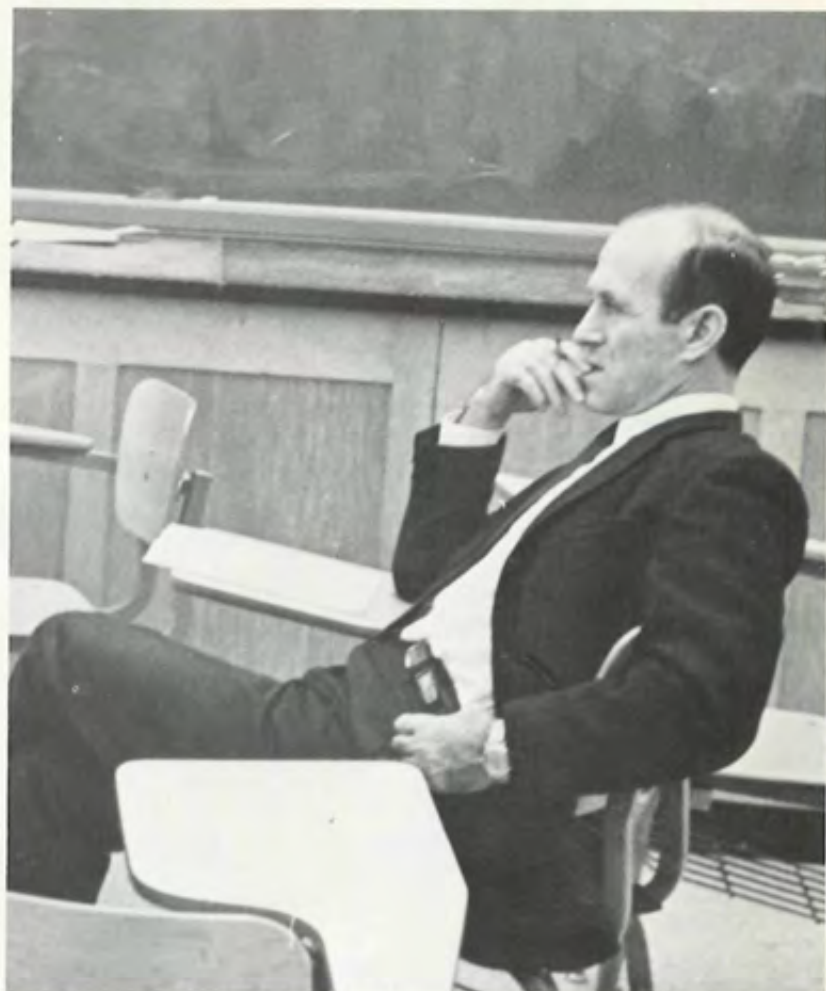
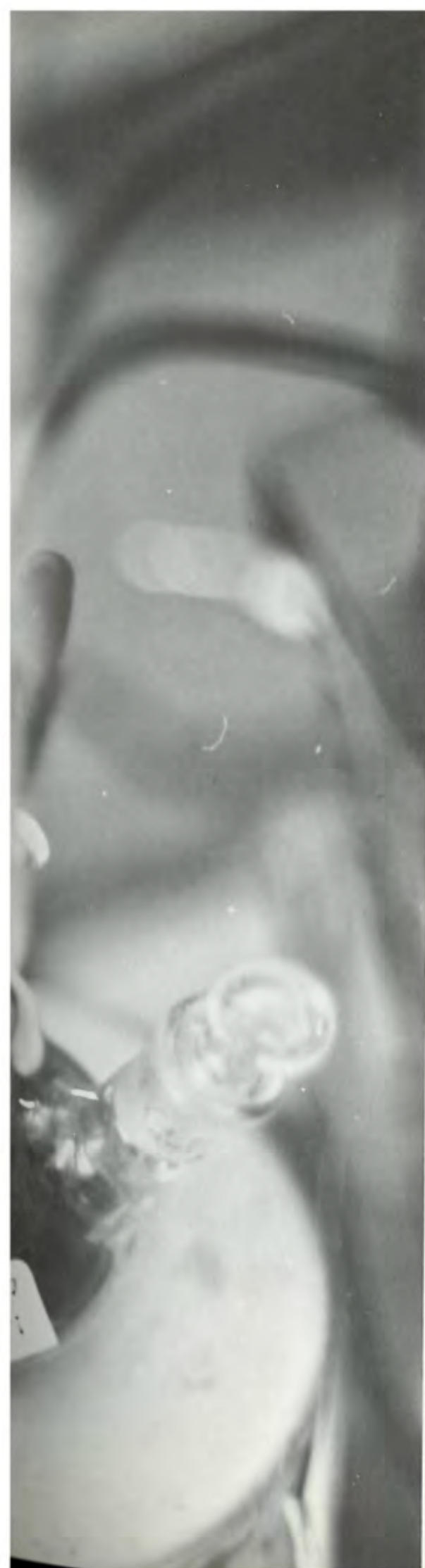
Grant Offered In Chemistry

Early Childhood And Elementary Education Department Offers Broad Program

The newly formed Department of Early Childhood and Elementary Education has been delegated the responsibility of providing professional training for students preparing to teach preschool and elementary school children. The members of the department are specialists in specific areas that contribute directly to the teaching competence of early childhood and elementary school teachers.

The department is very active, both on and off campus. At present, there is a seminar for New Math, which is directed by Dr. Annacone. Dr. Ward is involved with a National Science Foundation grant which provides in-service Foundation grant in science Curriculum Improvement Studies which provides in-service training for elementary school teachers. Another activity is the Paterson Plan, a special student teaching program, headed by Dr. Vitalone, which sends interested students into the city of Paterson to work with the disadvantaged.

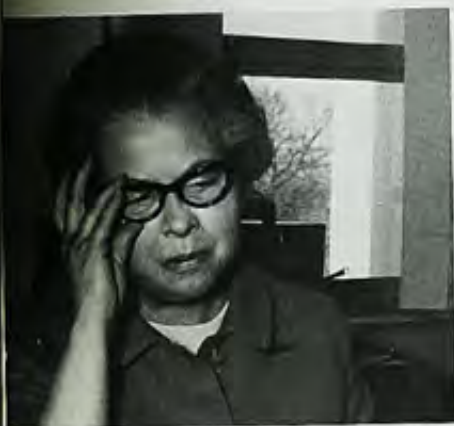
Projected Program For History

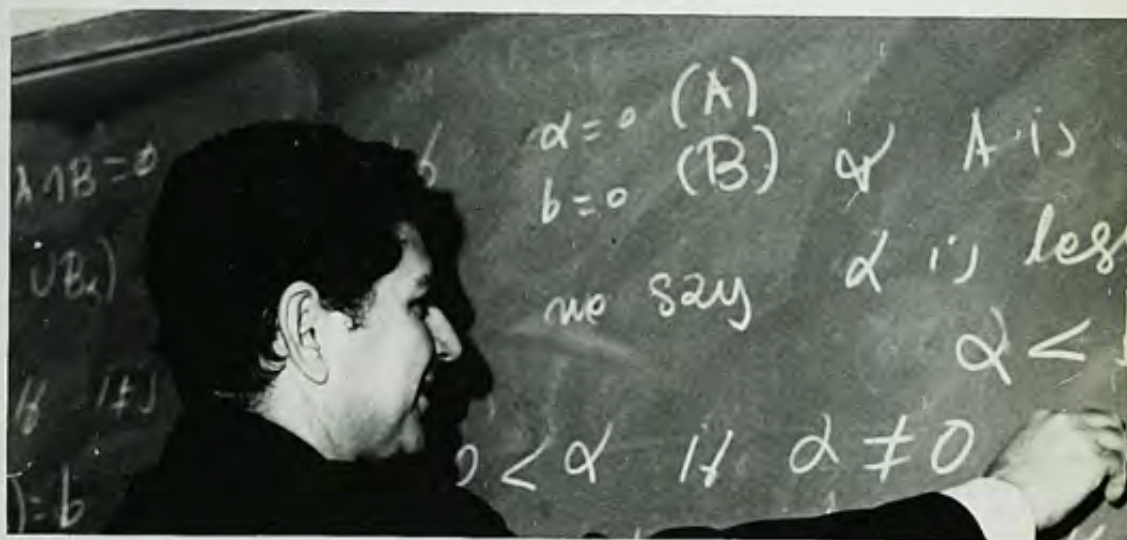
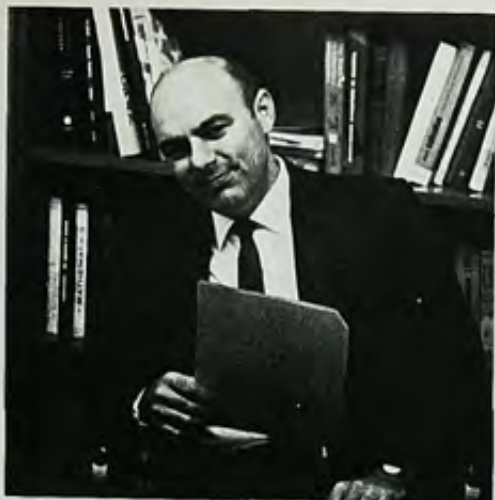


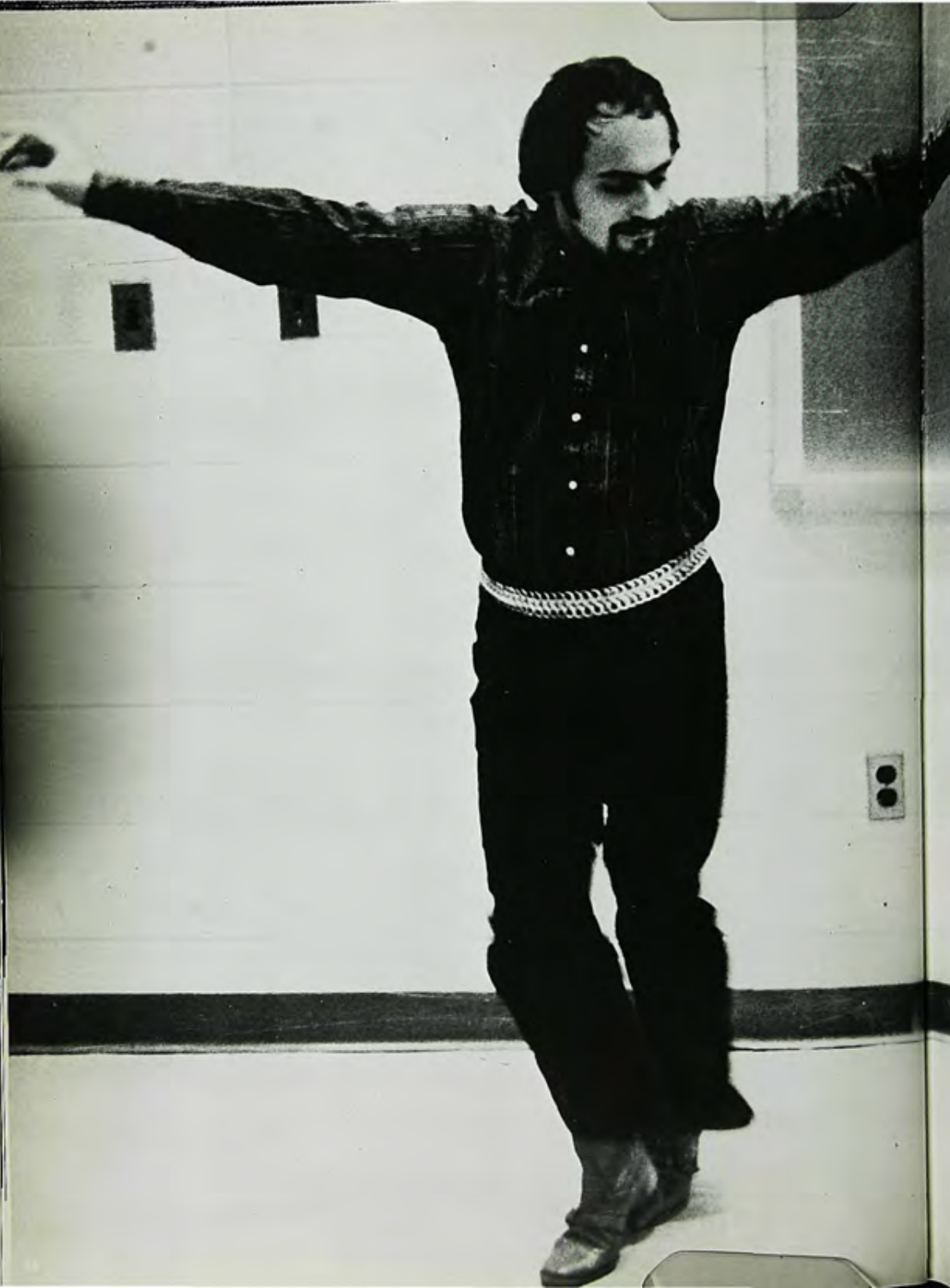
An Insight Into Computers

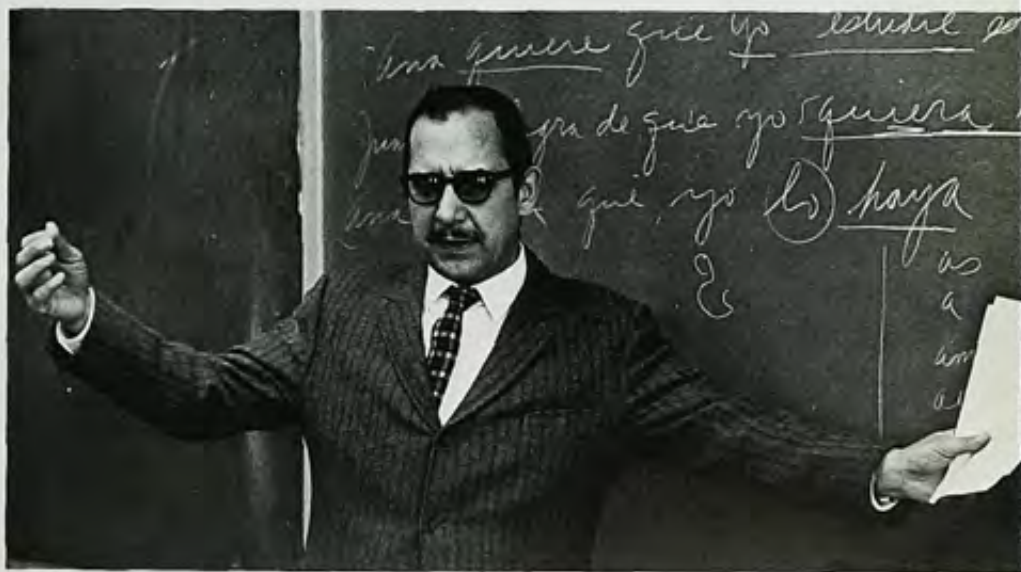




Modern Language Keeps Pace

Our four diversified vocal groups join together twice a year to provide varied entertainment at Christmas and in the spring.

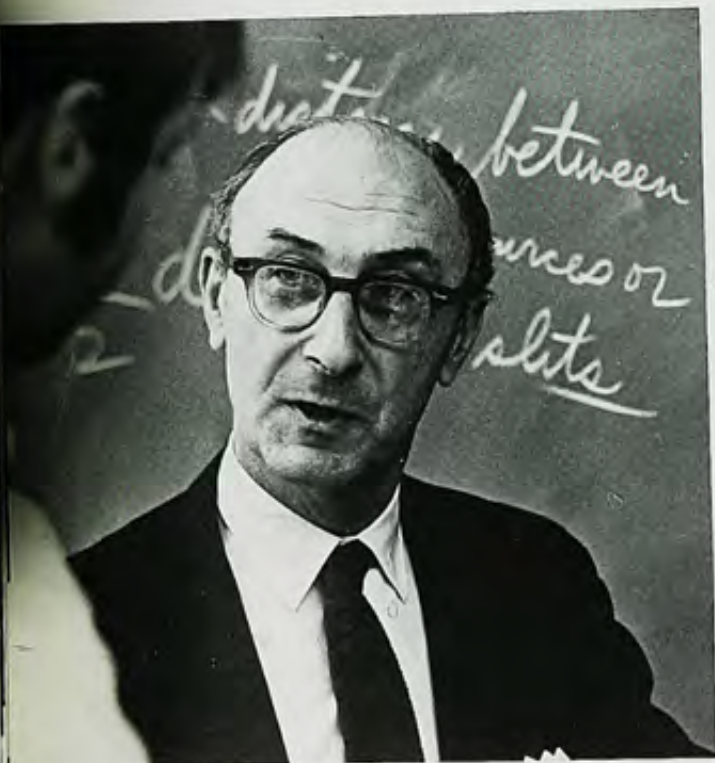

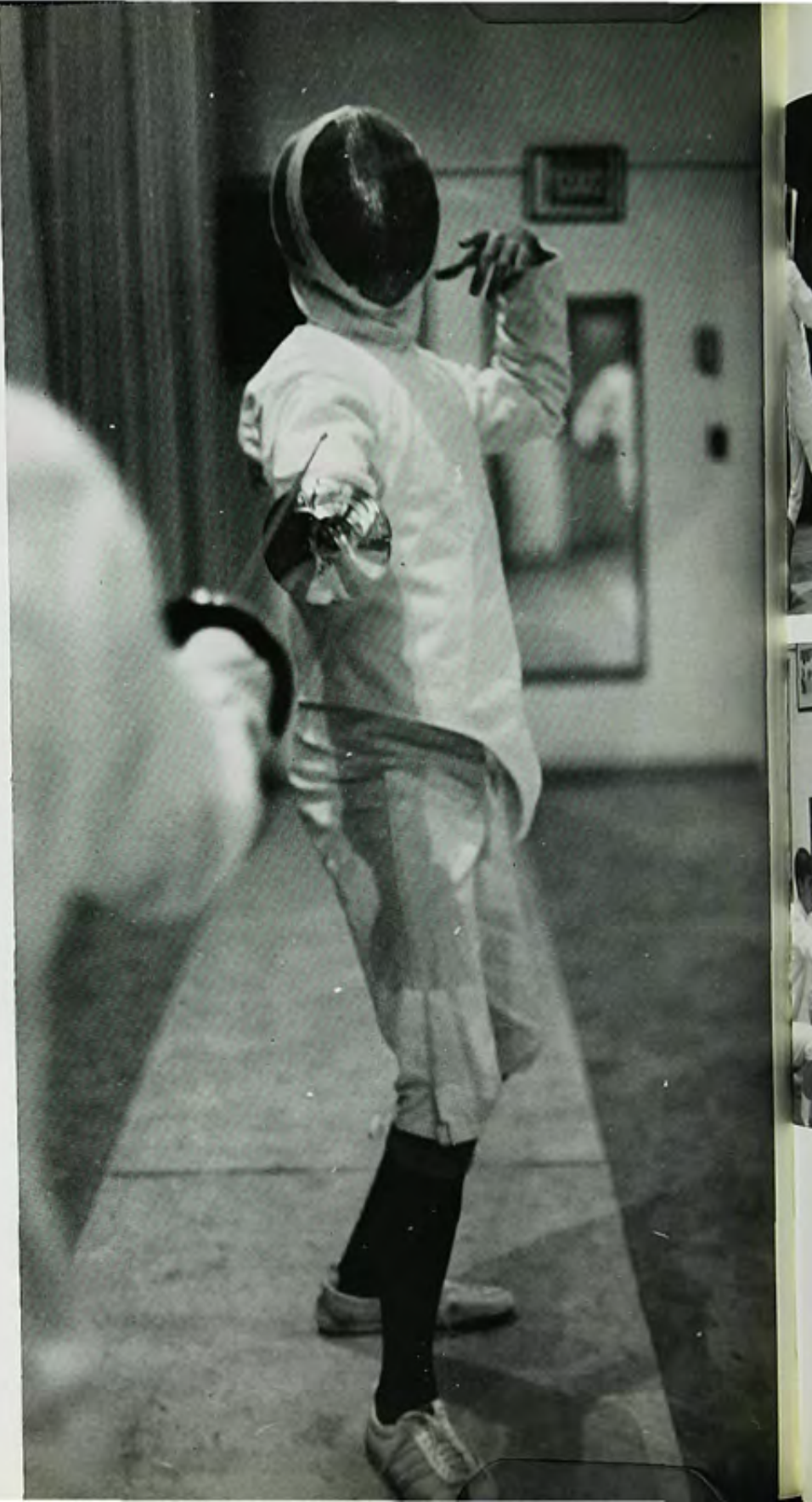
Mermaids First Winning Season
