MESSAGE TO THE CLASS OF 1972

The departure of the Class of 1972 leaves me with feelings of deep satisfaction, some sadness and a bit of nostalgia.

As I watched you receive your diplomas at Commencement, I had the fleeting thought that, perhaps, I should be among you. Your class and I were "freshmen" together. I came to William Paterson College in 1968, the year most of you began careers at this College, and you were even generous enough to award me a freshman beanie at my inauguration.

A lot changes between the freshman and senior year. William Paterson College certainly has changed. In fact, it wasn't even William Paterson when you were freshmen. The name change is symbolic of the quantitative growth, and more importantly, the transformation of the fundamental nature of the institution. We are now a bona fide regional state multipurpose college, and each year we are broadening our mission to better meet the needs of our students and our community. As we continue this movement, the degree you've just received will grow in value and esteem along with the College.


The Class of 1972, like so many previous graduating classes, enters a turbulent society and faces a future of bright promise laced with ominous portent. In a more stable era, I might have confidently predicted for each of you that if you work hard at your respective jobs, material comforts and happiness will surely follow. That prediction sounds a bit hallow right now. To begin with, your generation has flatly refused to assume that material comforts and secure careers are equated with happiness. And, more than any other generation, you find these traditional aspirations hard to pursue in the face of some blatant inequities in society.

Faced with the sweep of problems in society, it is small wonder that many have succumbed to the temptation of despair. I find this the easy way out, and one of the recurring heartening experiences I enjoy each year is to find out again what a great proportion of our students and your generation as a whole simultaneously refuses to accept the status quo and refuses to despair of being able to improve it.

Your growing involvement in the decision making in our society; your insistence that the price of progress must not include the sacrifice of our environment; your demand for quality in your daily lives, from the articles you buy to the education you receive, all indicate to me that you are confident that the things you are seeking in society and life in general are within your grasp.

Each of you must and will find your own role in bringing about these ends, a role suited to your individual capabilities and temperament. You now have the responsibility to seek this role, and to avoid always the temptation to take that easy way out.

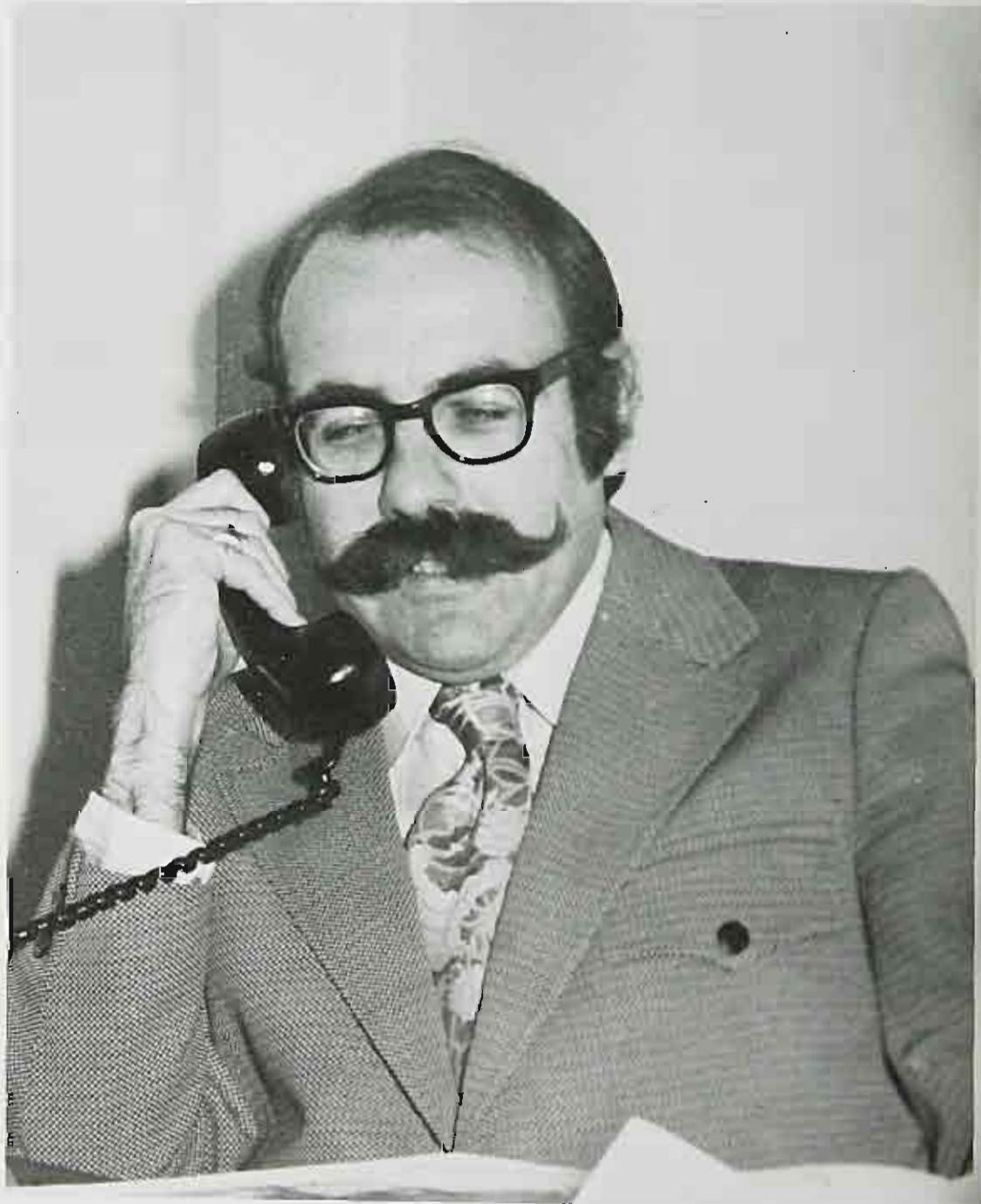
Deans

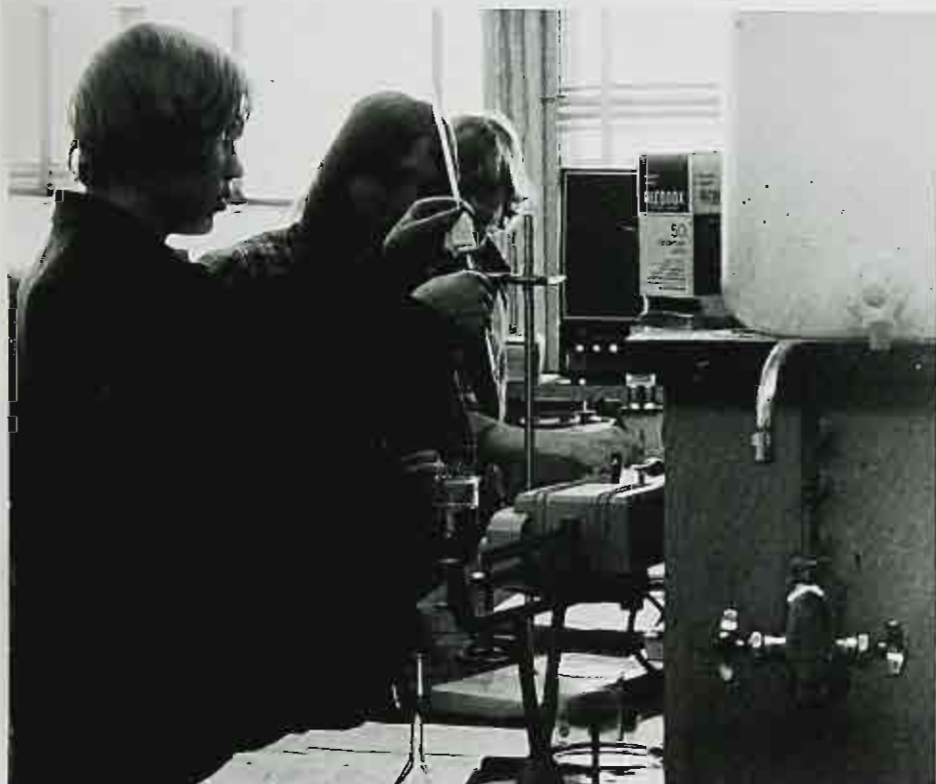

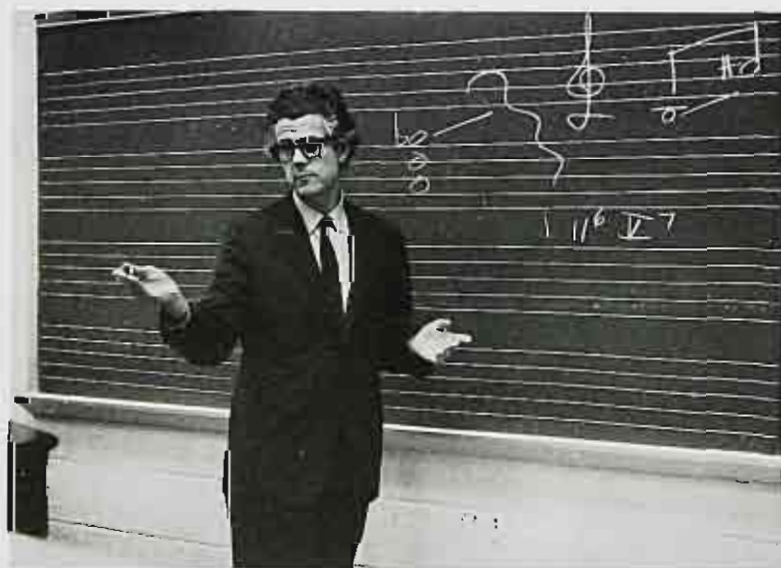

Physics — Earth Science

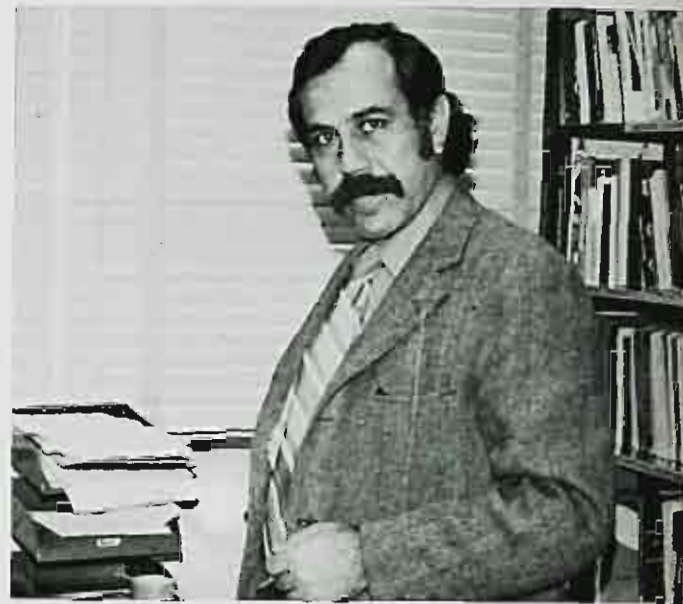
The Physics — Earth Science Department administers programs in physics, geology and astronomy and participates in interdisciplinary programs in these fields including the environmental sciences.

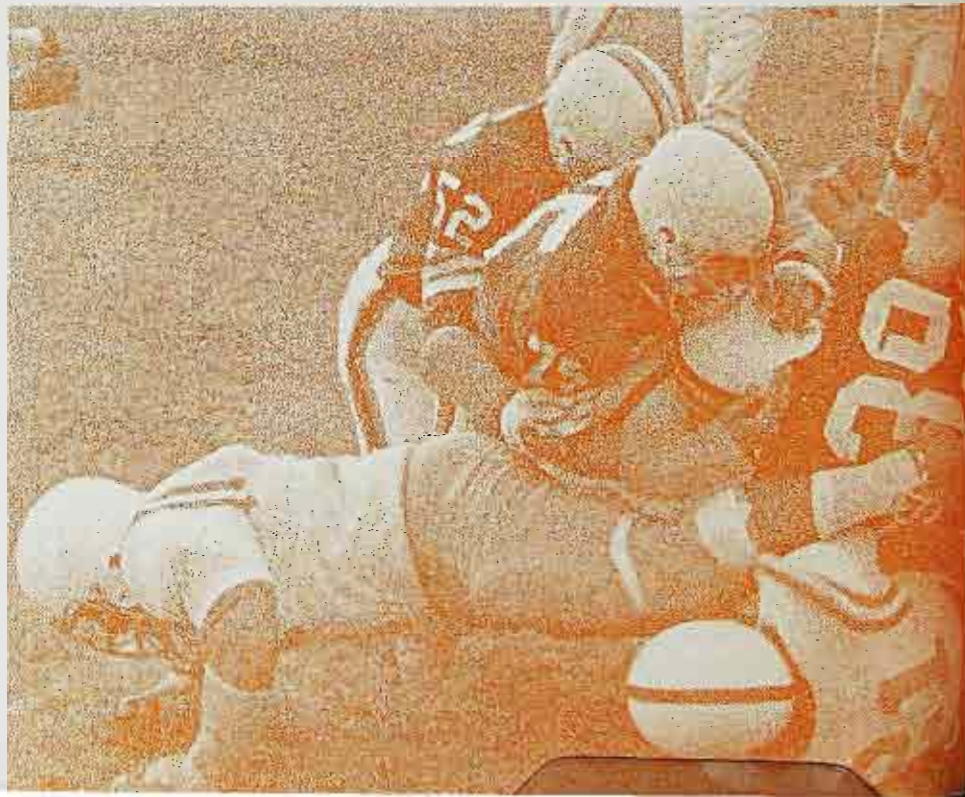
The Pioneers began the 1971 Football season with a new name, a new coach, and a new offensive formation.

The 1971 Cross Country team ended its season with a 9-1 record, with the only loss coming at the hands of an outstanding Montclair State College team. Once again Junior Tam Fleming was the number one man across the finish line in all ten dual meets. Throughout the season he was followed closely by Art Moore and senior captain Tom Greenbowe. On several occasions they combined to take the top three spots and insure a William Paterson victory.

Backing up the front three runners were Senior Jahn Pontes, Sophomore Carl Foote, and three Freshmen who showed signs of ability, Les Kostolanci, Andy Korkes, and Lorry Flarkiewicz.



Soccer

The William Paterson College of New Jersey soccer team posted an eight win and four loss record in a tough 12-game schedule. Co-captains Alan Corazza and Rich Mattea guided the team to a third place standing in The New Jersey State College Athletic Conference.

Head soccer mentor "Will" Myers was selected as league Soccer Coach of the Year and was also named 1971 New Jersey College, "Coach of the Year," by the New Jersey Soccer Coaches Association. Goalie Harold Leek and backs Vincent Sausa and Stanley Bavaro were selected "First Team" N.J.S.C.A.C. All three were previous "honorable mention" selections.

Goalie, Hal Leek, had the distinction of being selected to the "First Team" 1971 All-Pennsylvania-New Jersey-Delaware Area Team. Leek registered five shutouts for his second consecutive year for the Pioneers and allowed just nine goals in 12 games for a spectacular .75 goals per game average. Back-up goalie Ray Spadaro was voted by his teammates for the "Dedication and Effort" Award, as was halfback Richard Stark.

The Black-and-Orange outscored its opponents 20-10 for an average of 1.67 goals scored per game to a mere 83 goals allowed. The Pioneer booters made 228 shots on goal to 165 for their opponents.

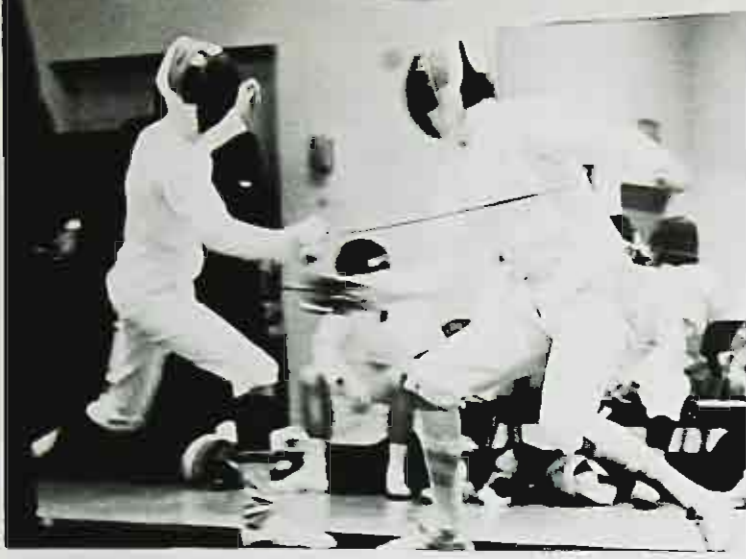




Men's Fencing

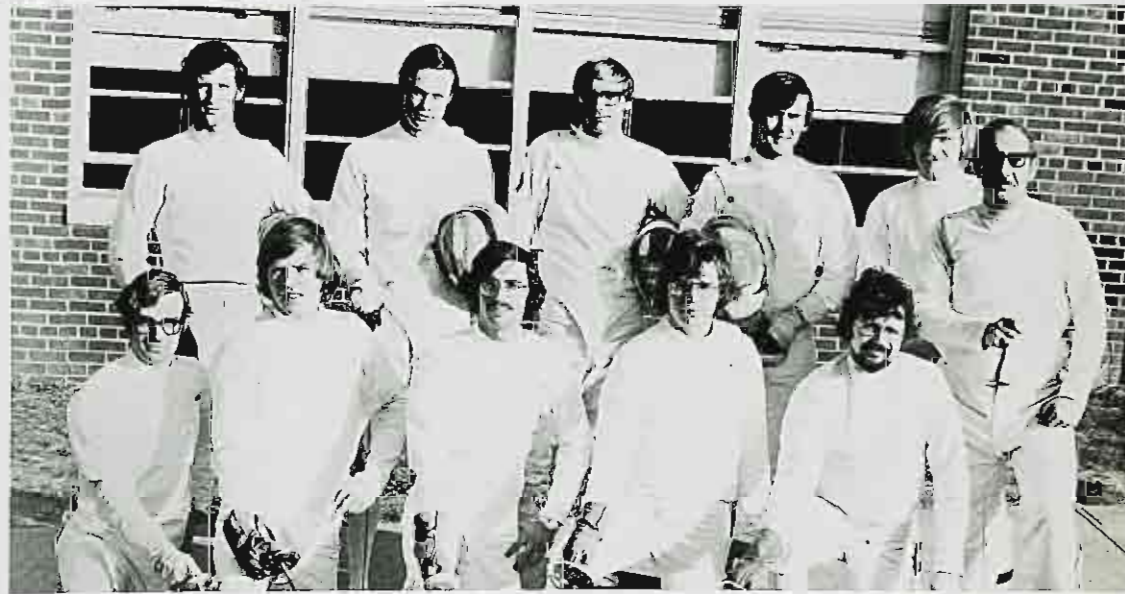

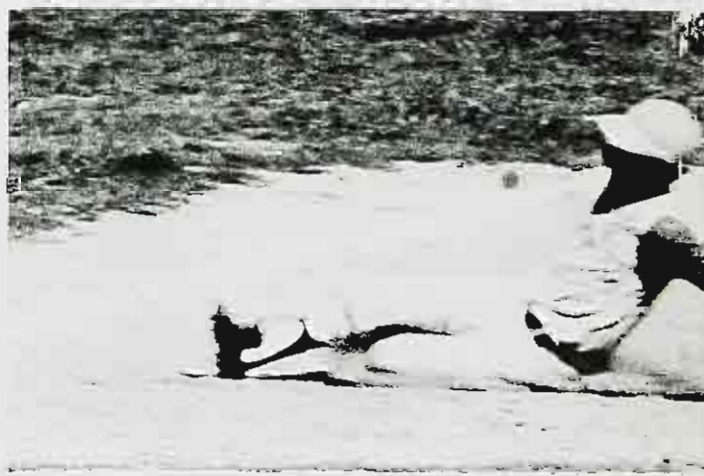
Baseball
