An Interview With

Q: IN WHAT WAYS ARE THE STUDENTS DIFFERENT FROM WHEN YOU WERE IN COLLEGE?

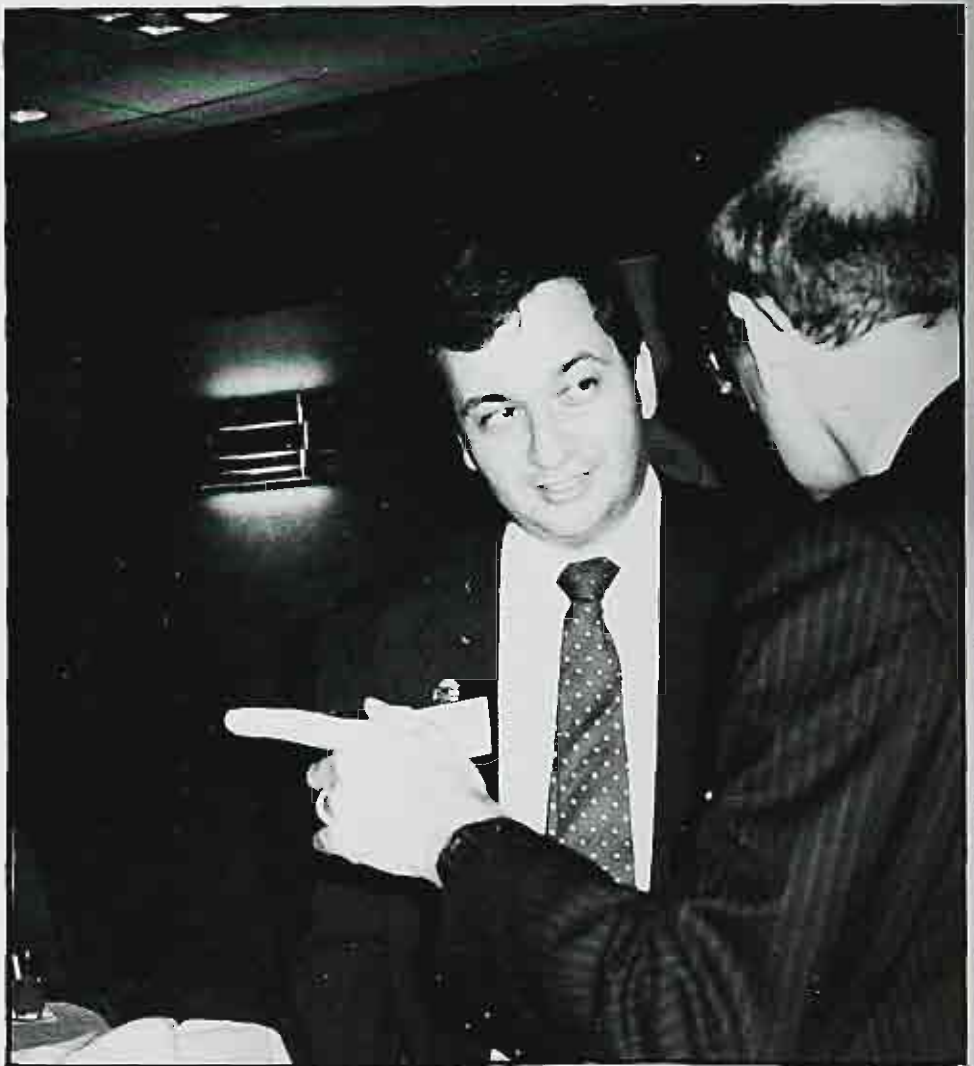
A: I think that the students today are much more job conscious than when I was in college. I don't mean to say that the students weren't interested in work at the college, but there was a sense of confidence that there would be a job sometime after college and today the students come to college looking at a job. I think it's the college's responsibility to broaden their perspectives and horizons, to look beyond the world of work. We know today what we've estimated that graduates today change jobs five times and maybe careers three times. It is important for us to prepare the individuals to be able to make those kind of decisions.

Q: IN WHAT WAYS ARE THEY SIMILAR?

A: It's an interesting time of life to be largely in the 17-21 period, and that is what students are looking for great independence and at the same time they're worried about breaking lines of dependency they are used to and comforted by, in fact they begin to set up other dependencies. It's growing up it's maturing and it's learning to be on one's own. I should also say something about the untraditional student, the student who has been out of school for a while and comes back, the older student. Which is not very different. Those students existed years back and exist today. I think the students are becoming much more aware of that consistency in their attempts as we are to provide a meaningful experience for students who enroll here.

Q: WERE THERE ANY GOALS YOU SET THAT YOU WERE UNABLE TO FULFILL AT THIS TIME?

A: No, I think I remained on track in the things that I initially set out to accomplish. The only thing that I find that I had to come to terms with is the fact that things don't happen as quickly as I'd like to see them and that I haven't accomplished as much in the amount of time that's past. But by and large things that are important like a sense of community, sense of involvement there has been a big improvement.

Q: WHAT WAS THE GREATEST CHALLENGE YOU HAD TO FACE IN YOUR JOB?

A: Learning to deal with as many constituencies as I needed to deal with.

Q: IF YOU COULD WAVE A MAGIC WAND TO CHANGE SOMETHING WHAT WOULD IT BE?

A: More time. Ten day weeks and thirty six hours days.

Q: IF YOU HAD CHOSEN AN OCCUPATION OTHER THAN THE ONE YOU HAVE, WHAT WOULD IT BE?

A: I have no idea.

Q: WHAT ADVICE WOULD YOU GIVE TO A STUDENT WHO IS GRADUATING?

A: Become involved in their communities, to bring what they have learned from college to whatever occupation and avocation they choose to involve themselves in, because they'll continue their learning growth at the same time they help others. The other things is that they become continually involved with William Paterson College because we need the input from Alumni and I also think that we could be of service to Alumni. WPC community doesn't stop at the gates. It goes beyond to eternity of time and distance.

Q: WHAT DO YOU SEE AS YOUR BIGGEST ACCOMPLISHMENT AS PRESIDENT OF THE COLLEGE?

A: I can't think of any single accomplishment that stands out. I'm happiest at seeing the extent to which student services has strengthened on campus. I think that there is a greater attention being given to support services and to the general area of student life, residents life and also activities on campus. I think that that's very important and I think that it has been neglected in the past.

Q: WHAT ARE YOUR MAJOR GOALS FOR THE FUTURE?

A: I'd like to position William Paterson College to be a much more intricate component and in fact as a center of economic development in the region as well as cultural and intellectual center. I think we've come a great distance over the 18 years that I've been here, as a cultural and intellectual area. I'd like to see us grow further as an integral group.

A: HOW DO YOU FEEL ABOUT YOUR CHANGE IN POSITION?

A: Right now I'm very happy doing what I'm doing. In fact I'm probably happier right now than I've been in a very long time at the college. And the reason that I'm happy is because the position allows me the opportunity to work more closely with the students and that's why I'm here. I'd give my whole life's worth toward students. Q: HOW WOULD YOU DESCRIBE THE CLASS OF '88?

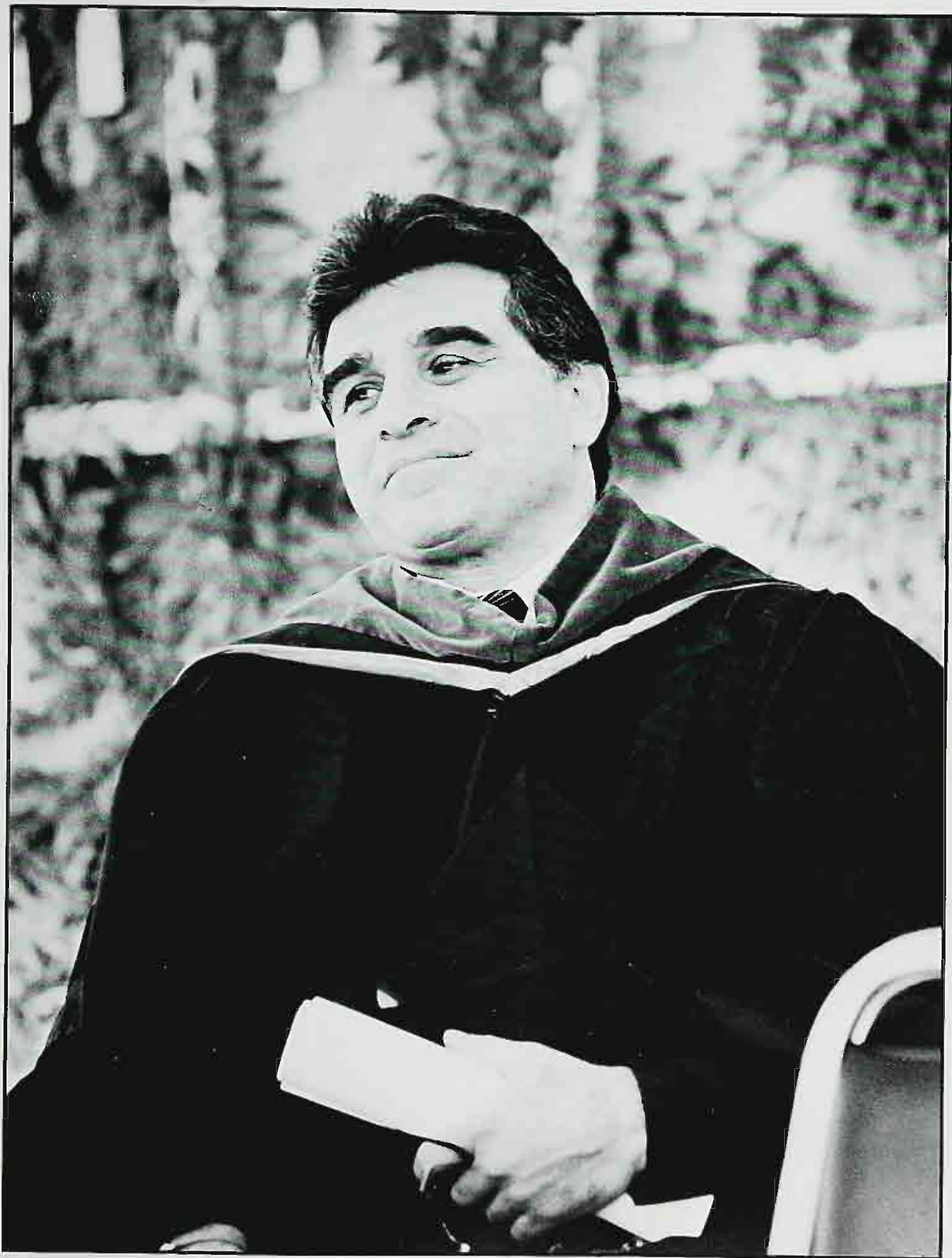
A: It's a good class. I know the leadership within the class Kim, Paulo, Joanne, Don, and Anita. I'm working very closely with them I'm serving as an advisor this year. It's a good class because I've seen

them grow over the years. I think it's one of the more enthusiastic classes. I think they're pretty active.

Q: HOW DO YOU FEEL ABOUT THE LACK OF PARTICIPATION IN THE ACTIVITIES?

A: Certain campuses have their own individual characteristics or profiles. This campus is primarily a commuter campus when you have a commuter campus you'll find that many of the students come on campus, take their courses and leave. I would venture a guess that 85%-90% of our students work so they have work commitment. I think that I have seen more activity this year than I've seen in a long time. I think the key to more student involvement and more student activity, and this might be my personal opinion, is IFSC. I really see them possibly as the group that can generate a lot

of enthusiasm, excitement and participation on campus because the organization covers so many fraternities sororities, and little sister organizations. So I think that if you have a stronger IFSC as well as a strong SAPB and you get the word out. The key is to communicate and try to have activities that appeal to a wide cross section of people. I think that people will come to participate in clubs, organizations and activities. Look at Homecoming. Homecoming was a huge success, with the floats. I've never seen so many people at the football game. The campus was really alive that night and I like to see that. That was a combination of SAPB, SGA, and IFSC working together with the administration to foster that kind of participation. So I'm encouraged. I think I'm seeing more of participation this year than I've seen in a long time.

**Season Record: 2-7****Conference Record: 1-6**

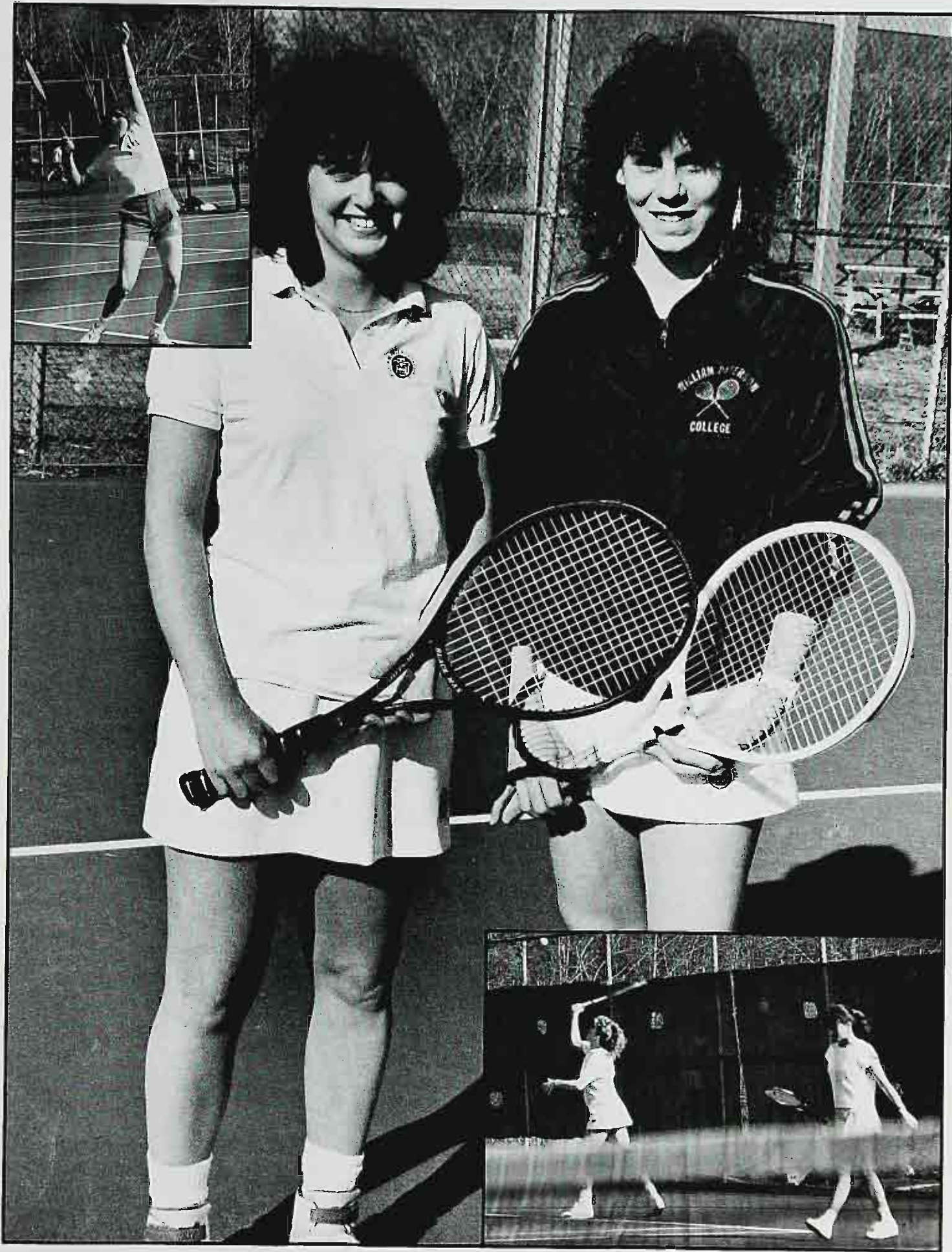

The inspired play of freshman center Jill Struble and freshman guard Michelle Jones provided the team with two key cornerstones needed for victory in the years to come. Struble averaged 13.6 points per game, while pulling down a team high 8.4 rebounds per contest. Jones scored an outstanding 459 points in her first year of collegiate competition, including a career high 42 points against the Roadrunners of Ramapo. In recognition of her season performance, Jones was named ECAC "Rookie of the Year", and Second Team All-Conference.

Coach Delehanty and her squad of Lady Pioneers are riding high on playoff hopes for the future.
