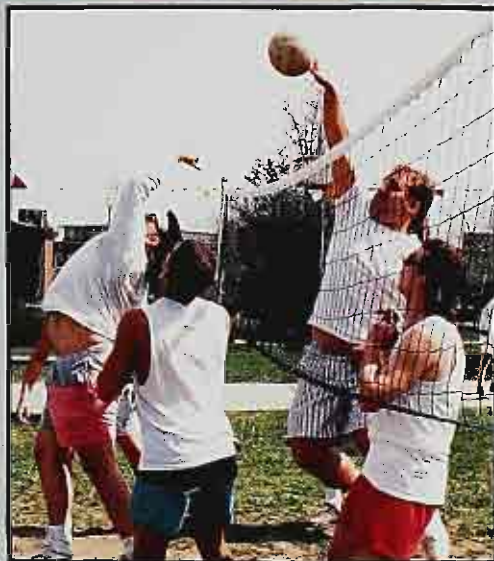

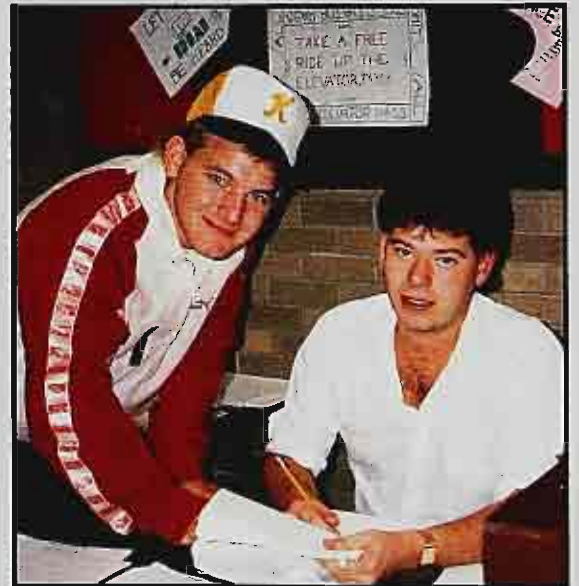

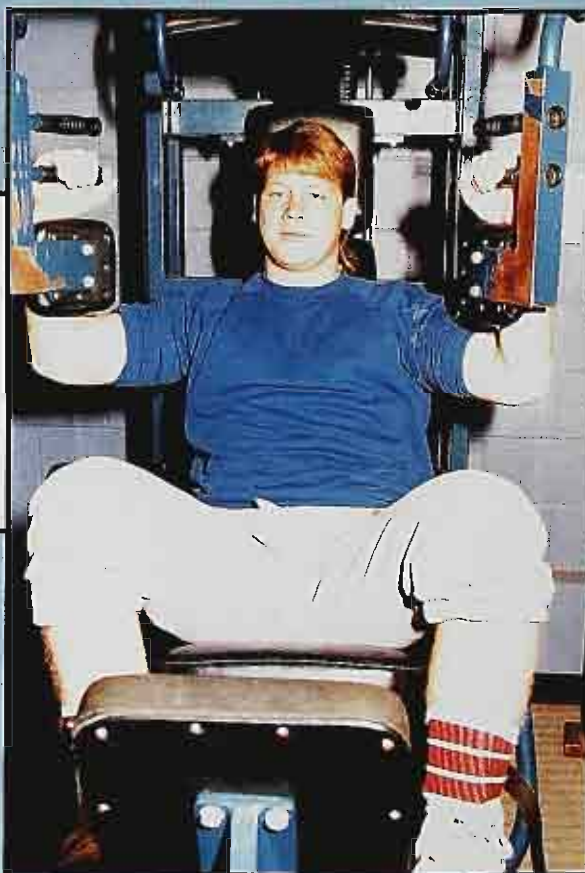

Despite their loss to Montclair, the Pioneers celebrated their annual Homecoming on Friday, October 13, 1989.

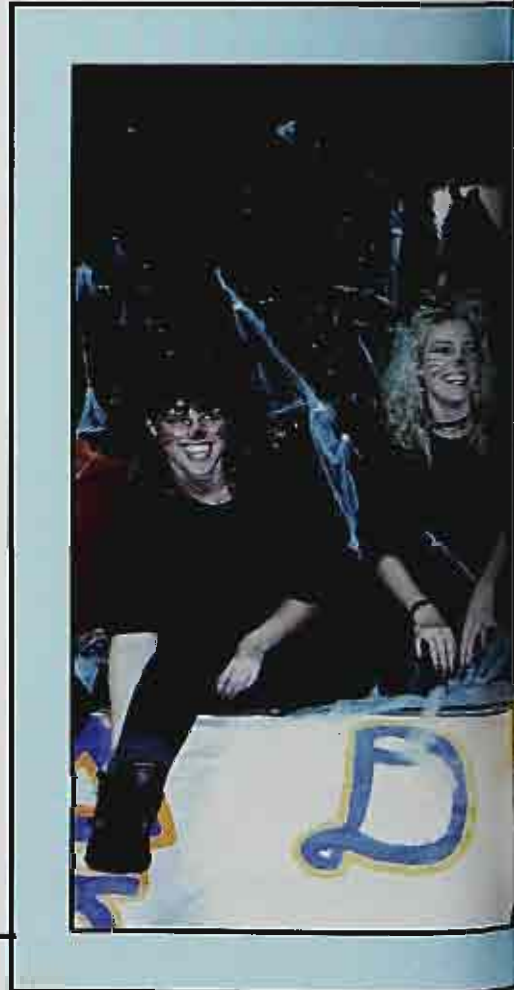

Batman was the blockbuster movie of the year. Batman (Michael Keaton) triumphed in the movie, but the Joker (Jack Nicholson) was the big winner at the bank.

Roseanne, the season's smash TV sitcom, starred wisecracking Roseanne Barr as a "model" for working class mothers everywhere, while John Goodman, her beer-drinking, warm-hearted husband was a far cry from TV fathers of the past.



The heavy metal/pop group Skid Row began as a songwriting partnership between guitarist Dave "The Snake" Sabo and Rachel Bolan and approached stardom with the addition of outrageous front man Sebastian Bach.

Multi-talented Paula Abdul, who began her career as a choreographer teaching other rockers how to dance, reached superstardom this year with a top-selling album and red-hot videos.



At 5:04 p.m. on October 17, before millions of viewers awaiting the start of the World

Series game between the San Francisco Giants and the Oakland Athletics, an earthquake

measuring 7.0 on the Richter scale rocked northern California. More than 60 were killed,

hundreds were injured, and the damage topped \$2 billion.

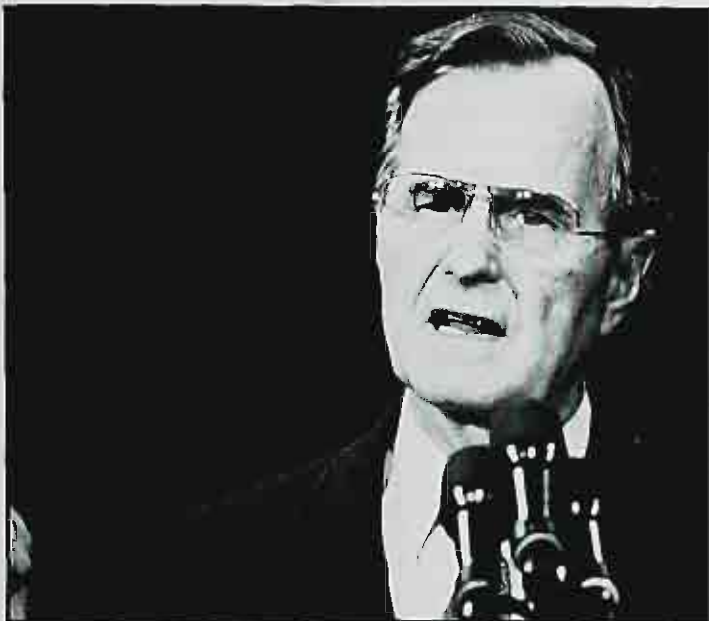
The Year In Review

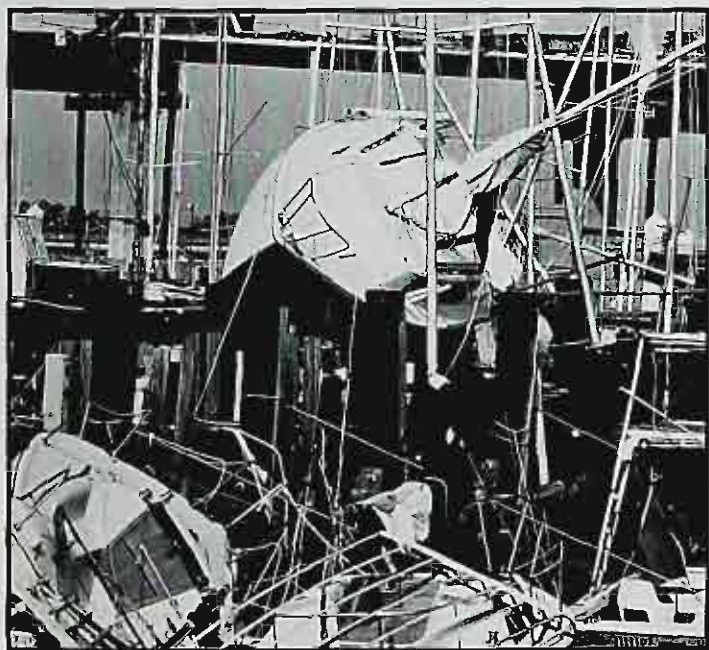
President George Bush shed his wimp image by ordering the invasion of Panama, thus earning increased popularity with the American public.
