Head Coach, Ed Gurka finished his 21st season at the Helm.










Long time minor league manager Rocky Bridges was credited with the following quotation: "Well, there are three things the average man thinks he can do better than anybody else: build a fire, run a hotel, and manage a baseball team.'

If William Paterson College coach, Jeff Albies can build a fire, or run a hotel as effective as he can mange a baseball team, than the hotel would be as grand as the Plaza in New York City, and the fire would be as large as a fire blaze.

For Albies, one of the top collegiate skippers in the country, is not your "average man" when it comes to coaching a baseball team. Last season his Pioneers captured their second NCAA Division III Title in five years in a thrilling 6-5 win over California Lutheran. Pioneer teams win, whether it be the 1992 and 1996 National Championship seasons or just another 30-win season. Albies, Pioneer coaches and players always get the job done.

He has won 30 or more games, 10 times captured two National Championships, appeared in six Division III College World Series and has 10 New Jersey Athletic Conference titles under his belt. Albies' 602 career victories rank sixth in the nation among Division III coaches and his .712 winning percentage places him 10th. in 1996 Albies Garnered the National and Mid-Atlantic Region "Coach of the Year" awards. Those career achievemnts which few, if any will ever match - have elevated Albies to the status of "Living Legend" on the WPC campus.
