# MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE WILLIAM PATERSON UNIVERSITY OF NEW JERSEY

## Friday, February 2, 2018

The meeting was called to order at 9:05 a.m. in the College Hall Board Room.

## APPROVAL OF MINUTES NOVEMBER 17, 2017 BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING:

The minutes of the November 17, 2017 Board meeting were approved as distributed.

#### CHAIR'S REPORT:

Mr. Seeve welcomed everyone, including those present and those participating by teleconference.

The Board is looking forward to working with our new governor, Phil Murphy, the Secretary of Higher Education, and NJASCU in advocating for public higher education in the state. We want

to maintain an active leadership role with the governor and elected officials in strengthening public support for higher education, and the importance of a four-year college degree in providing leaders for the state's workforce in years to come.

Mr. Seeve welcomed Dr. Michael Klein, former Executive Director of NJASCU, and presented him with special recognition for his leadership of NJASCU and current interim directorship of the William J. Hughes Center for Public Policy at Stockton University. Mr. Klein's advocacy on behalf of public higher education, his close relationships with key policy makers in state government, and his partnership with the state college presidents helped to shape the future of higher education for the public sector.

It was moved by Mr. Seeve and seconded by Mr. Galandak to adopt the following resolution:

The resolution was unanimously adopted.

Mr. Klein thanked the Board of Trustees noting what a great pleasure and privilege it has been to work with them.

Mr. Seeve reminded the Board of Trustees that we are entering the public phase of the Presidential Search, with finalists coming to campus for intensive two-day interviews and the names of the finalist to be announced on February 5. The Board encourages all members of the William Paterson University community to meet each candidate during the Open Forums and provide feedback.

Over the next few months, the Board will publicly acknowledge the achievements and momentum that have been achieved over the last seven-and-a-half years under President Waldron's leadership.

#### PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

President Waldron expressed her excitement as the University welcomed back students and faculty to the Spring Semester. She reported on new measures for improving fall 2018 enrollments, including the addition of new degree programs and a more focused social media effort on high school students both in senior and junior years.

President Waldron congratulated faculty and staff recipients of external grants and awards, including Michael Griffiths, Nicole Davi, Emily Monroe, and Nancy Norris-Bauer.

President Waldron commended our students who participated in the Dr. Martin Luther King Day of Service. Students contributed their time to social service agencies in Paterson, Bloomfield, and Nutley. Another group of students were featured in *The Record* about their travels to Vieques, Puerto Rico in early January for a weeklong humanitarian mission to help rebuild the radio station there that was destroyed by last year's hurricane.

President Waldron noted that the construction of the new residence hall is proceeding on schedule despite the extremely cold weather in late December/January, with occupancy expected

in fall 2019. The renovation of Hunziker Hall is proceeding ahead of schedule with completion expected this spring and occupancy this summer.

The 28<sup>th</sup> Annual Legacy Gala will be held on April 19, 2018 at The Grove in Cedar Grove. Former Foundation Board Member and alumna Linda Bowden will be the graduate alumna honoree, and Enterprise Systems will be the corporate honoree.

President Waldron congratulated VP Stuart Goldstein and his Marketing and Public Relations Department who earned four awards in the Fifth Annual Education Digital Marketing Awards, sponsored by Higher Education Marketing Report.

## **GOVERNMENT AND COMMUNITY AFFAIRS REPORT:**

AVP DeDeo reported on the new administration being seated under Governor Phil Murphy, and we are awaiting the nomination of a new Secretary of Higher Education.

Our partnership during the past two debates has enabled students to work with the CBS crew and with faculty and the Deans Office in Arts and Communications. CBS television director Jason Hark will meet with our news production practicum class to give them a bird's eye view of professional practice. WPU will also send a group of students into NYC to visit Mr. Hark at WCBS.

Mr. Pesce mentioned we have unique opportunities at the start of the new Governor's termto put our students in front of the Governor and personalize things. President Waldron mentioned that we are strategically looking for opportunities to interact such as hosting College Radio Day.
