MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE WILLIAM PATERSON UNIVERSITY OF NEW JERSEY

Saturday, March 5, 2011

The meeting was called to order at approximately 9:05 a.m. in the College Hall Board Room.

ANNOUNCEMENT CONCERNING ADEQUATE NOTICE OF MEETING:

In accordance with the "Open Public Meetings Act," the Chairperson publicly announced and had entered into the minutes that "adequate notice" of this meeting was provided. In compliance with the Statute, this notice was posted on the University's web page and distributed to The Record, and The Star Ledger more than 48 hours prior to this meeting.

MINUTES OF THE DECEMBER 10, 2010 BOARD MEETING:

The minutes of the December 10, 2010 Board meeting were approved as distributed.

CHAIR'S REPORT:

Mr. Mazzola spoke briefly about the Governor Christie's budget message delivered two weeks ago. There is a recommendation for the overall State budget to be reduced by 3% but the higher education budgets will remain flat. For William Paterson University that is approximately a \$32.8 million appropriation for general operations. Mr. Mazzola noted that if union contract negotiations result in salary adjustments, the State has not allocated any monies for these possible increased expenditures. Also, as in the past, there are no appropriations for capital expenditures.

Mr. Mazzola reported that we are finalizing plans for the Middle States visiting team who will be on campus March 20 through March 23 to conduct our decennial accreditation site visit. The team is being led by Dr. David Soltz, President of Bloomsburg University. The Board is part of a group of over 100 invited to have dinner with the Visiting Team on Sunday afternoon. A smaller group, consisting of the Executive Committee along with Anna Mascolo, will meet with the Visiting Team on March 22. The closing meeting where the Team will present their findings to the University community is scheduled for March 23.

Mr. Mazzola shared a few news items about William Paterson University including President Waldron's appearance on "Caucus New Jersey" with Steve Adubato. Professor Jim Tsiamtsiouris of the University's Speech and Hearing Clinic, a specialist in the treatment of stuttering, was featured in an article in The Record focusing on the problem of stuttering. The article has now been picked up by wire services and was published in more than 50 newspapers and websites across the country. Last week, News 12 featured research by Professor Joseph Spagna on spiders.

The Women's Basketball Team won the New Jersey Athletic Conference Championship for 2011 and is competing in the NCAA Division III Women's Basketball National Tournament. William Paterson University is hosting the first and second rounds of the Tournament and the WPU team won the first round last evening against Keuka College. Congratulations to the team and coach, Erin Monahan.

Paterson native, Melva Cadmus Radcliffe, recently celebrated her 110th birthday and was featured in articles in The Record and The Star Ledger. She is a graduate of the Paterson Normal School, the predecessor institution of William Paterson University.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

President Waldron thanked the Chair for highlighting the positive press and visibility the University has experienced recently. The President spoke about the Kean Report, the Governor's budget message, Middle States visit, progress on the University Core Curriculum, and an open budget forum held recently on campus. The President highlighted new grants and gifts to the University, recent awards by faculty and students, the reaccreditation of the master's program in counseling by CACREP, achievements in athletics including the Women's Basketball Championship, the league championship men's ice hockey club team, and WPU's top ranked national bowling club team. Finally, President Waldron spoke about hosting Lt. Governor Kim Guadagno on campus along with a group of influential women business leaders in the state, the hiring of a new Vice President for Enrollment Management pending Board approval, progress on the national search for a dean of Humanities and Social Sciences, the arrival of a new Executive Director of Development, and the announced retirement of VP Sandra Deller. A copy of the President's written report is attached.

President Waldron asked for a moment of silence in memory of Professor Robert Rimmer, Department of Educational Leadership and Professional Studies in the College of Education, who died suddenly two weeks ago.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

FINANCE, AUDIT AND INSTITUTIONAL DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE:

Ms. Linda Niro reported that the Finance, Audit and Institutional Development Committee met on February 8, 2011. Ms. Shelly Masi, Partner at KPMG and Ms. Mary McCauley, Senior Manager at KPMG presented the results of the Fiscal Year 2010 Federal A-133 and New Jersey 04-04 External Audit conducted by KPMG to the Committee. Ms. Niro introduced Ms. Masi, who outlined the audit conducted, including the programs audited. Ms. Masi noted that programs selected for audit are those with significant dollars and those considered more risky. She reviewed the guidelines used, and the results. The audit revealed no findings for 2010 and 2009. The Board thanked Ms. Masi for her report and her attendance at the Board meeting.

Ms. Niro reported that the Committee recommended the following resolution for Board approval:

The resolution was unanimously adopted.

Mr. Mazzola stated that the bid waiver process is a thorough one and that before any bid waiver comes before the Board for approval, it is first vetted by the Finance Committee, with the budgeted funds certified by the VP of Administration and Finance, and reviewed by Deputy Attorney General for compliance with all applicable statutes.

NOMINATIONS AND GOVERNANCE COMMITTEE:

Mr. Taylor provided some background on the evolution of the present Nominations and Governance Committee. Over the last ten years it has expanded its scope from a single charge of recommending a slate of officers to encompass other trustee issues including orientation, and development of candidates, and has recently reorganized to be in compliance with the Lesniak legislation. It is a standing Committee of the Board and its actions have become more formalized. Mr. Taylor said there is a fine balance in reporting the work of this Committee between business that is confidential in nature and the goal of transparency. The Committee has been working on developing criteria for identifying potential candidates using guidelines from the Governor's Task Force, the Association of Governing Boards and William Paterson's own history. The Committee also prepared revised charges to the five standing Committees of the Board – Educational Policy and Student Development Committee, Executive Committee, Finance, Audit and Institutional Development Committee, Nominations and Governance Committee and Personnel and Compensation Committee. The revised charges comply with the provisions of the Lesniak bill enacted into law by the State of New Jersey in 2010.

PERSONNEL AND COMPENSATION COMMITTEE:

Ms. Mascolo presented for the committee chair, Dr. Henry Pruitt. The Committee met on February 18, 2011 and discussed recommendations for emeritus status, tenure by exceptional action, faculty promotions, managerial reappointments, overload assignments, adjunct assignments, graduate assistants appointments, as well as various other personnel matters. Ms. Mascolo thanked President Waldron and the staff for presenting a thorough explanation of the requirements to be awarded emeritus status and tenure by exceptional action. President Waldron acknowledged those promoted faculty present in the audience, including Professor Paula Danzinger, Associate Professor Salika Lawrence, and Professor Stephen Betts.

EDUCATIONAL POLICY AND STUDENT DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE:

Mr. Pesce reported that the Educational Policy and Student Development Committee met on February 7, 2011 and continued their work and focus on strategic concerns and opportunities for the University. The Committee began the year by identifying specific areas for discussion including technology for facilitating teaching and learning and support for underlying infrastructure; enrollment, retention and graduation rates; and faculty development. All of the issues discussed will be included in the strategic planning process to begin this spring. At the February 7 meeting the Committee discussed Enrollment Management and Retention, which included admission criteria, the composition of the student population, the composition of the incoming 2011 fall class and the significant increase in the number of transfer students. Efforts that resulted in increased enrollment over the last two year were recognized. The presentation by VP John Martone and Senior VP Ed Weil provided the platform for in depth discussion of the numerous factors that impact enrollment growth, retention and graduation rates.

OTHER BUSINESS:

Professor Ron Verdicchio, Faculty Senate President commended the Board and the leadership of Mr. Pesce as Chair of the Educational Policy and Student Development Committee. He commented that the February 7 meeting was a very engaging meeting with meaningful discussion on important topics. He suggested in support of shared governance at the University that a change in venue for committee meetings be considered to promote the opportunity for attendance, that public comment be encouraged, and that the minutes of the committee meetings along with documents used at the meetings be posted on the website for viewing by the University community. Professor Verdicchio thanked the Board for their consideration. Mr. Mazzola thanked Professor Verdicchio for his comments and suggestions.

RESOLUTION, REVISIONS TO THE WILLIAM PATERSON UNIVERSITY BOARD OF TRUSTEE COMMITTEE CHARGES

RESOLVED:

That the William Paterson University Board of Trustees approves the revisions to the William Paterson University of New Jersey Board Committee Charges for the following committees: Educational Policy and Student Development Committee, Executive Committee, Finance, Audit and Institutional Development Committee, Nominations and Governance Committee, and the Personnel and Compensation Committee.

Charge to the Educational Policy and Student Development Committee

The Educational Policy and Student Development Committee reviews and makes recommendations to the Board of Trustees concerning all policies that shape and govern the academic mission, educational programs and student life at the institution. Areas of attention include but are not limited to:

- Mission statement
- Review of academic and student development strategic plans
- Proposals for new academic programs and major changes to existing programs, including the application of technology to teaching and learning
- Educational and programmatic effectiveness, including the development and monitoring of relevant "dashboard indicators" in the academic and student development areas
- Enrollment management, including enrollment goals, admission requirements, retention and graduation rate goals and policies
- Conferral of degrees, including honorary degree and president's medal nominees
- Student development policies
- Athletics
- Residence life matters
- Student diversity
- Student health and campus safety

Charge to the Executive Committee

The Executive Committee shall consist of the Chair, Vice-Chair, and chairs of the standing committees. It shall be empowered to act for the Board in an emergency, subject to ratification by a quorum of the Board as soon as possible.

This Executive Committee will consider Board organization and operation, presidential evaluation, long-term planning and other matters at the decision of the Chair of the Board.

The Executive Committee serves as a forum for the consideration of significant institutional issues and priorities that transcend the jurisdiction of other committees of the Board, and considers upon matters that are referred to the Committee by the President, Board or one of the other standing committees of the Board for study and possible resolution.

The Committee shall keep minutes of all of its meetings.

Charge to the Finance, Audit and Institutional Development Committee

The Finance, Audit and Institutional Development Committee is charged with assuring sound fiscal and administrative oversight of the University by developing recommendations to the Board of Trustees in at least the following areas:

- Operating budgets for the coming year(s)
- Capital budget
- Tuition and fees
- Policies and guidelines on revenue sources and expenditure distributions
- Long- and short-range fiscal planning
- Planning for capital expansion / replacement / renewal
- Property acquisition / utilization / disposition
- · Selection of external auditors
- Review of and acceptance of annual audit by external auditors
- Recommending to the Board of Trustees the appointment of the internal auditor and reviewing the internal audit schedule and results of internal audits
- Requests for bid waivers
- Legal issues pertaining to administrative operations of the University
- Institutional development, fundraising, marketing and alumni relations in collaboration with the Foundation Board and Alumni Executive Council
- Assisting the board in ensuring and safeguarding the integrity of the institution's financial statements
- Assisting the board in overseeing and evaluating the performance of outside auditors retained by the institution
- Assisting the board in overseeing and evaluating the performance of the institution's internal audit function
- Ensuring that allegations of misconduct or conflict of interest are evaluated and investigated
- Ensuring the institution's compliance with all relevant legal and regulatory requirements
- Preparing an annual audit committee report for submission to the institution's governing board
- Policies concerning professional services contracts which, at a minimum, shall include procedures for the review of proposed professional services contracts to verify the need for the proposed services, determining whether conflicts of interest exist between the vendor and the institution, ensuring appropriate procurement procedures are utilized, determining whether the proposed compensation is reasonable, and monitoring the services delivered by the vendor

Charge to the Nominations and Governance Committee

The Nominations and Governance Committee shall support the Board of Trustees by undertaking the following:

- Overseeing matters directly affecting the governance of the institution
- Periodically reviewing and updating Board by-laws
- Identifying and screening candidates for membership on the governing board
- Referring candidates to the governing board for the consideration of the Board in making its recommendations to the governor on potential new members. In identifying candidates for appointment to the governing board, the committee shall seek individuals with skills that are appropriate to the mission of the institution and which complement the range of expertise contributed to the governing board by its existing members. The committee shall seek candidates of diverse background and experience, as well as those with ties to the institution.
- Establishing criteria for the identification, qualification, and recommendation of prospective candidates for appointment to the Board. The criteria shall include qualification criteria that are consistent with the statutory responsibilities of the Board and tailored to the institution.
- Preparing, maintaining, and overseeing an orientation program for newly-appointed Trustees that includes: a) provision of all appropriate reference material, b) an understanding of the Board's practices and modes of operation, c) introductions to key members of the administration, d) an understanding of the "culture" of Board operations, e) the Board's relationship to the university President and the recent history of the Board's role in institutional progress and f) the applicable conflict of interest and code of ethics guidelines for trustees
- Being attentive to the contributions and circumstances of individual Trustees with the intent of helping to improve their ability to contribute, adjusting to their time limitations where necessary, and, where mutually agreed upon, supporting a recommendation to the Board chair and President to propose their reappointment by the Governor to an additional term.
- Preparing a slate of officers for election to office (Chair, Vice Chair, Secretary) as required by State statute or when vacancies occur.

Charge to the Personnel and Compensation Committee

The Personnel and Compensation Committee reviews and makes recommendations to the Board of Trustees concerning personnel actions brought forward by the President that affect faculty, professional and managerial staff. Areas of attention include but are not limited to:

- Establishing and evaluating the compensation for the president, vice-presidents, and other senior administrators of the institution
- Making recommendations to the board on issues relating to the compensation of the president, vice-presidents, and other senior administrators including the amounts, types, and components of compensation plans, and the performance measures and targets upon which institutional administrators shall be evaluated for purposes of calculating incentive awards
- Reviewing recommendations of the president concerning faculty reappointments, including reappointments conferring tenure and professional staff reappointments, including appointments and reappointments to multi-year contracts
- Consistent with the University Faculty Retention Policy, review written appeals of non-recommended candidates for reappointment who allege "inadequate consideration."
