The meeting was called to order at approximately 9:10 a.m. in the College Hall Board Room.

At approximately 10:35 a.m., the Public Session resumed.

MINUTES OF THE FEBRUARY 21, 2004 BOARD MEETING:

The minutes of the February 21, 2004 Board meeting were approved as distributed.

CHAIR'S REPORT:

Gwen Taylor, Chair, spoke about the Student Success Plan, approved by the Trustees at the last meeting. The Board considers the plan a great achievement and values all the input and involvement of the University community in its development. It will serve as the blueprint to guide the direction of the University over the next five to ten years. Ms. Taylor, on behalf of the Board, urged the University community to support the Plan and give it careful attention.

Ms. Taylor introduced a newly elected student trustee, Aaron Burroughs, who will be sworn in at the September Board meeting to officially begin his term. The Board congratulated Mr. Burroughs on his election and welcomed him.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

- 1. The President reported that there is no update on the budget as it affects the University.
- 2. The President noted that faculty would present three examples of faculty-student scholarly collaboration. He noted that a competition is sponsored each year by the Art Directors' Club of New Jersey, which is the largest and oldest professional graphic arts association in New Jersey. It is a portfolio competition and each school can submit up to 20 portfolios, each containing up to 8 pieces. Professor Angela DeLaura's advanced Graphic Design, Packaging and Advertising and Illustration classes entered the competition and won six awards two in package design and four in graphic design. Professor DeLaura and her students were on hand to display their winning designs.
- 3. The President introduced Professor Emmanuel Onaivi of the Biology Department and his students who were selected by the Council for Undergraduate Research (CUR) to present their research before Congress on Capitol Hill. Their abstract was one of only 60 selected nationwide. CUR's goal is to present research reflecting the collaboration between undergraduate students and faculty to Congress with the aim of increasing funds for undergraduate research in American universities.
- 4. Dr. Speert introduced Professors Marty Weinstein and Steve Shalom of Political Science and student members of the William Paterson Model UN team. The team competed in Toronto against 17 universities representing 30 different countries. The William Paterson delegation, representing the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan, was selected as the best delegation at the conference. The students shared their experience of the competition and future plans.
 - Ms. Taylor thanked all the students and their professors on behalf of the Board for their presentations and applauded their accomplishments and enthusiasm.
- 5. A new video developed for the capital campaign, "Affecting Lives, Shaping Worlds," was shown. The video highlights several academic programs and features two trustees, Carla Temple and William Pesce.
- 6. Dr. Speert reported that baseball coach Jeff Albies has achieved his 800th win. In January he was inducted into the American Baseball Coaches Hall of Fame. He is now one of only three coaches in New Jersey to attain 800 wins.

FINANCE & AUDIT COMMITTEE:

Robert Taylor reported that the Committee had a meeting in April and among the items reviewed was enrollment, which surpassed 11,000 (~8400 FTE) in the fall '03 semester, reflecting substantial growth. At the tuition hearing held on April 29, a preliminary look at revenues and expenses reveals a \$9.5 million deficit for FY2005. Administration is looking at cost containment efforts to help close the gap before a decision is made on how much of a tuition increase is needed for FY2005.

Mr. Taylor introduced Mr. Paul Merrill of KPMG who described the External Audit findings for FY2003. Mr. Merrill also shared information on the new GASB39 standard which directs that affiliated organizations be shown as part of the reporting entity.

MINORITY AFFAIRS & STUDENT AFFAIRS COMMITTEES:

Sonia Rosado reported on the joint meeting of the Minority Affairs and Student Affairs Committees. A report on at-risk students was given with a description of the specific steps and programs being implemented to help this population of students. Opportunity Fest 2004 was a very successful career fair with over 85 employers and 1,000 students participating. The annual Vendor Fair was held on April 23. Plans are being formulated to make this a regional event involving several universities and possibly local businesses as well.

DEVELOPMENT REPORT:

Fred Gruel reported that fundraising efforts have exceeded \$1.8 million this year to date. We received a gift from the Estate of Jacob Rubin in the amount of \$500,000 for the establishment of the Aaron Rubin Scholarship. This is an excellent example of an untapped area of support – planned giving. Over the next several months we will be pursing the potential in planned giving. Alumni events have been attended by over 1500. In the Marketing and Public Relations area, we have received several awards for our "Live It, Learn It" campaign from the Art Directors' Club of New Jersey. A new website highlighting the University's 150th Anniversary has been launched.

At approximately 12:45 p.m., there being no further business, a motion was made and seconded for the meeting to be adjourned. The motion carried unanimously.
