### MINUTES OF THE MAY 7, 2005 BOARD MEETING:

The minutes of the May 7, 2005 Board meeting were approved as distributed.

#### CHAIR'S REPORT\_:

Mr. Taylor reported that Provost and Executive Vice President Chernoh Sesay would be taking a one year leave to develop a new master's of higher education and would then return to the faculty. He thanked Dr. Sesay for his ten years of service as Provost and noted the many achievements of the University under his leadership. The Board concurred and thanked Dr. Sesay for his service as Provost.

#### PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

- 1. Dr. Speert read a resolution from the New Jersey Association of State Colleges and Universities congratulating William Paterson University on its 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of excellence in teaching and service to the State.
- 2. The President introduced Mr. Bill Duffy, new President of the Faculty Senate.

- 3. President Speert gave an update on the state budget. He stated that the tuition and fee increases being acted on by the Board are based on the Governor's budget recommendations. However, there are continuing discussions within the legislature and with the Governor about funding property tax rebates and it is likely that the budget will not be adopted until after June 30. The outcome of their final decisions will need to be considered with respect to tuition and fees for 2005-2006. If any changes are necessary to what is before the Board today, they will be presented at a later date.
- 4. Dr. Speert introduced Mr. Chris Conzen and Mr. Jeff Wakeman of Campus Activities, who led a group of students, led by Ms. Faith Zahn, on an alternative spring break project. Ms. Zahn organized a group of students to participate in Habitat for Humanity Collegiate Challenge. The group of twelve students and two staff members traveled to Mechanicsville, Virginia where they worked on digging the foundation for a home for a single working father, who also cares for his disabled father. Ms. Zahn shared that the project was extremely rewarding and as a result the students are forming a Habitat Chapter at WPU to advocate on behalf of victims of poverty and generate help for people affected by poverty.
- 5. Provost and Executive Vice President Sesay gave a presentation on the Accomplishments, Innovations and Improvements of the Academic Year 2004-2005.

Mr. Fred Gruel reported that student trustee, Mauricio Mattos, has started a summer internship in Washington, D.C. and thus was unable to be present at today's meeting. He asked that the administration make a greater effort to educate students on ways they can assume an active role in advocating support for higher education to their legislators.
