### **CHAIR'S REPORT:**

### DEVELOPMENT REPORT:

VP Reiss reported that donations to the University last year amounted to \$2.2 million. This year we had two substantial bequests - one from Ray Miller, former fencing coach and history professor, and another from the brother of a former student who was a scholarship recipient in 1938. These bequests amount to almost \$1 million. We have received about \$125,000 in corporate donations, and the quiet phase of the Capital Campaign has been completed and we have received commitments for just over \$16 million. A kickoff for the Capital Campaign with a specific target will take place next fall.

### **OTHER BUSINESS:**

Faculty Senate Chair Mel Edelstein reported that the Senate's theme this year will be reaffirming academic excellence and student success through shared governance. Two programs are planned. The first will be held on October 10 - a forum co-sponsored by the Senate and the Provost on faculty advisement of students, problems and perspectives. The other forum will be held in Spring 2003 on retention. The Senate is also working with the Provost on developing an honor code for students. The Senate is looking forward to a very productive year.

Ms. Taylor thanked Professor Edelstein for his report and informed him that the Board of Trustees had received and reviewed the Senate evaluations of the President, Provost, and Vice Presidents. Their input was appreciated.

At approximately 12:35 p.m., there being no further business, a motion was made and seconded to adjourn the meeting. The motion carried unanimously.
