CHAIR'S REPORT:

Mr. Taylor welcomed everyone to the first meeting of the new academic year. He commented on and applauded the harmony that characterized the campus approach to the budget cuts. The concern for the well-being of the students is evident in the collegial and constructive approach to balance the budget in the face of record cuts. He mentioned several initiatives being undertaken including an enrollment management plan, an academic strategic plan, and enhanced efforts for philanthropy among old and new friends to help address the shrinking state support.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

President Speert introduced Robert Bennett, Dean Sandy DeYoung and Professor Lance Risley, who gave an update on the Science Building/Renovation project. Over the summer a great deal of work has been completed on the layout of the labs and classrooms. A slide presentation provided various views of the new building and renovated space and a model was on display for viewing.

Dr. Darryl Greer, Executive Director of the New Jersey Association of State Colleges and Universities (NJASCU), reported that he tries to attend the Board meetings once or twice a year to show support for the University and its initiatives. He receives the agendas and follows the issues at all the sister institutions. He acknowledged the service of Mr. Robert Taylor and Dr. Henry Pruitt on the NJASCU Board as well as President Speert. He noted that VP Bolyai will head up the NJASCU group of Vice Presidents of Finance and Administration. He reported that NJ public colleges and universities are among the most productive and efficient institutions in the nation based on a national study. Dr. Greer stated that NJASCU is working hard to get the message out about the value of higher education at NJ colleges and universities and trying to increase our advocates.

Bernadette Tiernan, Executive Director of Continuing Professional Education presented a business plan for our Continuing Education programs. A brief discussion was held on plans for a new winter session and modifications to the summer sessions.

INSTITUTIONAL DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE:

VP Deller reported that the Committee discussed the need to enhance the friend-making and fundraising revenue producing ability of Institutional Advancement to support initiatives of the University. They spoke about efforts to increase unrestricted gifts and plans to hire students to do the telemarketing for the Annual Fund. Alumni and friends will find it more meaningful to hear from students than professional telemarketers.

STUDENT AFFAIRS COMMITTEE:

Mr. Mazzola reported that the Committee received an update on the two new residence halls, High Mountain East and High Mountain West. A report on the learning communities in the residence halls was also presented. The committee also discussed the membership of the William Paterson University Auxiliary Corporation, Inc. and recommended the following resolution for approval:

Caitlin Grogaard and Hilary Goldman, current students representing a larger group, addressed the Board regarding their objection to the elimination of the Performing Arts Theatre Series under the direction of Ed Matthews and Shari Selke. They cited the many benefits, accomplishments, and successes of this program and its contribution to promoting their commitment to campus life. They provided background information including a position letter, fact sheet about the program, letters of concern from various individuals, and a petition objecting to the elimination of the Theatre series under the direction of Ed Matthews and Shari Selke.

Professor Joann Lee, Chair of the Communication Department, applauded the efforts of the students. She said the plans underway in the Department would provide opportunity for students to participate and grow in the theater area. At our sister institutions, theater programs are all intertwined with curriculum. None are stand-alone production units. This supports the greatest opportunity for growth. Professor Lee announced that open auditions are being held for two major productions, and she encouraged the students to participate.

subdivision of the State of New Jersey (the "State"), existing as such under any by virtue of

the constitution, statutes and laws of the State; and

Whereas: The Board of Trustees of the Issuer (the "Governing Body") has the power under the laws of the State to lease or purchase personal property for use by the Issuer; and the Governing

Body has determined, and hereby determines, that it is in the best interests of the Issuer to enter into an Equipment Lease-Purchase Lease (the "Lease") with Key Government Finance, a Sun Microsystems, Inc. business partner ("Lessor") for the purpose of financing the acquisition of the equipment (the "Equipment") described in Exhibit A to the Lease, and that the use of such Equipment is essential to the Issuer's proper, efficient and economic

operation; and

Whereas: The Governing Body has taken the necessary and appropriate steps under applicable law,

including, without limitation, any public bidding requirements, to arrange for the acquisition of

the Equipment under the Lease; and

Whereas: The Lease terminates, and the Issuer's obligations thereunder are extinguished, if the

Governing Body fails to appropriate money for the ensuring fiscal year for the payment of

the amounts due in such fiscal year; and

Whereas: There has been presented to the Governing Body the form of the Lease, including Exhibit A thereto, which the Issuer proposes to approve, enter into and deliver, as applicable, to effect that the proposed financing of the Equipment, and it appears that the Lease and its

effectuate the proposed financing of the Equipment; and it appears that the Lease and its Exhibit A are in appropriate form and are appropriate instruments for the purposes intended;

Now, therefore, be it resolved by the Governing Board as follows:

Section 1: That all actions of the Issuer in effectuating the Lease are hereby approved, ratified and authorized pursuant to and in accordance with the transactions contemplated by the Lease.

Section 2: That the Governing Board hereby approves the acquisition by the Issuer of the Equipment described in Exhibit A to the Lease, such acquisition to be financed by Lessor pursuant to and in accordance with the terms of the Lease, for a total cost not to exceed \$217,387.87, which will be a valid, legal and binding obligation of the Issuer enforceable in accordance with its terms. The form and content of the Lease are in all respects authorized, approved and confirmed and the President of the Issuer, or his designee is authorized, empowered and directed to execute and deliver the Lease for and on behalf of the Issuer in substantially the form attached hereto, but with such changes, modifications, additions or deletions therein as shall to him seem necessary, desirable or appropriate.
