<u>SWEARING IN – NEW STUDENT TRUSTEE:</u>

Newly elected student trustee, Aaron Burroughs was introduced and sworn into office by Ms. Jackson. Mr. Burroughs was welcomed with a round of applause.

CHAIR'S REPORT:

Ms. Sonia Rosado presided in Ms. Taylor's absence. Ms. Rosado presented a resolution recommending the election of officers for the academic year 2004-2005: Robert Taylor, Chair; Sonia Rosado, Vice Chair; and Carla Temple, Secretary.

It was moved and seconded to adopt the following resolution.

9-04-02 RESOLUTION, ELECTION OF BOARD OFFICERS (Appendix 2)

The resolution was unanimously adopted.

Mr. Taylor thanked the Board for the opportunity to serve as Chair. He commented on his twelve years of service on the Board, and the rich history of growth and changes in New Jersey higher education in general and at William Paterson University in particular. In 1994 New Jersey granted full autonomy to college trustees. This major change enabled this Board along with an administration with vision and leadership, and a faculty working in unison to plan and achieve substantial growth and progress.

Mr. Taylor presented Dr. Henry Pruitt and Ms. Clarice Jackson with plaques honoring them for their prior service as Chairs of the Board of Trustees.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

- 1. Dr. Speert reported that the University kicked off its celebration of the 150th Anniversary of the University's founding on University Day. Our original mission to provide education and opportunity endures today. Over the coming year we will honor the past, celebrate the present, and look forward to the future through a variety of events.
 - Lorraine Terraneo and Bob Seal, co-chairs of the 150th Anniversary Committee, provided an overview of the activities planned for the year.
- 2. The President introduced the new Executive Director of International Education, Dr. Jaime Ortiz.
- 3. A brief presentation describing two of the University's Study Abroad programs was presented. Professors Maria Tajes and Octavio de la Suaree brought a group of students to Spain to study at Universidad de Santiago de Compostella, and Professors Grisel Maduro and Gregory Shepherd brought students to the Universidad de Puerto Rico, Recinto de Rio Piedras.
 Students Michelle Malcolm, Taryn Gavlick and Aaron Burroughs shared their very positive personal experiences in their respective study abroad programs. They enjoyed the opportunity to learn the language, as well as the rich culture and diversity of both countries. The students said that faculty support, both from WPU professors and the host universities, was a major factor in the success of the program.
- 4. The President noted that each Board member received a copy of a report from the Provost on Faculty and Student Scholarly and Creative Accomplishments for the Academic Year 2003-2004. It is a comprehensive and impressive record of achievement.
- 5. President Speert spoke about Governor McGreevey's resignation and how it may affect higher education and the University. Dr. Speert said an orderly transition is planned, and Senator Codey would be sworn in as Governor. Senator Codey has a long and distinguished career of serving the interests of the citizens of New Jersey. However, the FY 06 state budget does not look good, there is currently a \$4.5 billion deficit. It will be a very trying time for our state.
